## HOUSE BILL 1320

## State of Washington 56th Legislature 1999 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to intercity passenger rail service; adding new 2 sections to chapter 47.79 RCW; and declaring an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 47.79 RCW 5 to read as follows:

Subject to appropriation, the department is authorized to acquire б 7 by purchase, lease, condemnation, gift, devise, bequest, grant, or exchange, title to or any interests or rights in real property adjacent 8 to or used in association with state intercity passenger rail service 9 10 which may include, but are not limited to, depots, platforms, parking 11 areas, and maintenance facilities. The department is authorized to 12 with a public or private entity for the operation, contract 13 maintenance, and/or management of these facilities.

14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 47.79 RCW 15 to read as follows:

16 Subject to appropriation, the department is authorized to accept 17 and expend or use gifts, grants, and donations for the benefit of any 18 depot, platform, parking area, maintenance facility, or other

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associated rail facility. However, such an expenditure shall be for
the public benefit of the state's intercity passenger rail service.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 47.79 RCW 4 to read as follows:

5 Subject to appropriation, the department is authorized to exercise all the powers and perform all the duties necessary, convenient, or 6 7 incidental to the planning, designing, constructing, improving, repairing, operating, and maintaining real property adjacent to or used 8 9 in association with the state intercity passenger rail service which may include, but are not limited to, depots, platforms, parking areas, 10 and maintenance facilities, even if such real property is owned or 11 controlled by another entity. However, any expenditure of public funds 12 for these purposes shall be directly related to public benefit of the 13 14 state's intercity passenger rail service. The department shall enter 15 into a written contract with the affected real property owners to secure the public's investment. 16

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. This act is necessary for the immediate 18 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 19 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 20 immediately.

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
