## HOUSE BILL 1496

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the distribution of health care coverage
- 2 enrollment information; and adding a new section to chapter 74.09 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 74.09 RCW 5 to read as follows:
- 6 (1) Although Washington offers comprehensive health coverage to

low-income children, as many as ninety thousand eligible children are

- 8 not enrolled. Children's access to timely and appropriate health care
- o not enforced. Children's access to timely and appropriate hearth care
- 9 is essential to their ability to receive a good education, become 10 productive workers, and be empowered to help fellow citizens in need.
- 11 For that reason, it is paramount that as many eligible children as
- 12 possible be enrolled in available state health care programs.
- 13 (2) No later than September 1, 1999, the secretary of social and
- 14 health services, the administrator of the state health care authority,
- 15 and the superintendent of public instruction shall implement a
- 16 children's health care outreach program to inform children and their
- 17 parents of the availability of the medical assistance program and the
- 18 basic health plan. Outreach information shall explain, in an easy to
- 19 understand presentation, at least: Eligibility standards; program

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- 1 benefits; and the importance and advantages of a child's enrollment.
- 2 Outreach information must be available in the English and Spanish
- 3 languages and may be available in other languages if deemed appropriate
- 4 by the agencies. Prior to implementation, the agencies shall analyze
- 5 available research on reasons why eligible children are not enrolled
- 6 and review existing outreach programs deemed successful.
- 7 (3) The agencies shall seek and are authorized to receive private 8 and public gifts or grants that would assist in the funding of the
- 9 outreach program.
- 10 (4) The agencies shall submit to the appropriate committees of the
- 11 legislature an outline of the program's design by August 1, 1999, and
- 12 a brief status report of the program's implementation by August 1,
- 13 2000.

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
