- 1 AN ACT Relating to punitive damages for wrongful death or personal
- 2 injuries caused while driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs;
- 3 and adding a new section to chapter 4.24 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 4.24 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (1) A person who drives a motor vehicle while under the influence
- 8 of intoxicating liquor or any drug and as a result of that condition
- 9 proximately causes personal injury or wrongful death of a victim or
- 10 victims may be liable for punitive damages in addition to damages
- 11 otherwise recoverable. The trier of fact shall determine the amount of
- 12 any punitive damages. No punitive damages shall be payable under any
- 13 liability insurance contract covering the driver.
- 14 (2) The court shall ensure that one-half of any punitive damages
- 15 collected is deposited in the public safety and education account under
- 16 RCW 43.08.250, to be appropriated for crime victims' compensation. No
- 17 fees or costs may be paid out of the portion of punitive damages to be
- 18 deposited in the public safety and education account. No agreement for
- 19 the payment of attorneys' fees may calculate fees against a base that

- 1 includes the portion of punitive damages to be deposited in the public
- 2 safety and education account, and any agreement to the contrary is void
- 3 as against public policy and unenforceable.
