- 1 AN ACT Relating to the professional development program; amending
- 2 RCW 28A.400.200; creating a new section; providing an effective date;
- 3 and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.400.200 and 1997 c 141 s 2 are each amended to 6 read as follows:
- 7 (1) Every school district board of directors shall fix, alter,
- 8 allow, and order paid salaries and compensation for all district
- 9 employees in conformance with this section.
- 10 (2)(a) Salaries for certificated instructional staff shall not be
- 11 less than the salary provided in the appropriations act in the state-
- 12 wide salary allocation schedule for an employee with a baccalaureate
- 13 degree and zero years of service; and
- 14 (b) Salaries for certificated instructional staff with a masters
- 15 degree shall not be less than the salary provided in the appropriations
- 16 act in the state-wide salary allocation schedule for an employee with
- 17 a masters degree and zero years of service;
- 18 (3)(a) The actual average salary paid to basic education and
- 19 special education certificated instructional staff shall not exceed the

district's average basic education and special education program 1 certificated instructional staff salary used for the state basic education allocations for that school year as determined pursuant to 4 RCW 28A.150.410.

- 5 (b) Fringe benefit contributions for basic education and special 6 education certificated instructional staff shall be included as salary 7 under (a) of this subsection only to the extent that the district's 8 actual average benefit contribution exceeds the amount of the insurance 9 benefits allocation provided per certificated instructional staff unit 10 in the state operating appropriations act in effect at the time the compensation is payable. For purposes of this section, fringe benefits 11 12 shall not include payment for unused leave for illness or injury under 13 28A.400.210; employer contributions for old age survivors RCW 14 insurance, workers' compensation, unemployment compensation, and 15 retirement benefits under the Washington state retirement system; or 16 employer contributions for health benefits in excess of the insurance 17 benefits allocation provided per certificated instructional staff unit in the state operating appropriations act in effect at the time the 18 19 compensation is payable. A school district may not use state funds to 20 provide employer contributions for such excess health benefits.
- (c) Salary and benefits for certificated instructional staff in 21 programs other than basic education and special education shall be 22 consistent with the salary and benefits paid to certificated 23 24 instructional staff in the basic education and special education 25 programs.
- 26 (4) Salaries and benefits for certificated instructional staff may exceed the limitations in subsection (3) of this section only by 27 separate contract for additional time, additional responsibilities, or 28 29 incentives, and as specified in section 2 of this act. Supplemental 30 contracts shall not cause the state to incur any present or future 31 funding obligation. Supplemental contracts shall be subject to the collective bargaining provisions of chapter 41.59 RCW and the 32 provisions of RCW 28A.405.240, shall not exceed one year, and if not 33 34 renewed shall not constitute adverse change in accordance with RCW 35 28A.405.300 through 28A.405.380. No district may enter into a supplemental contract under this subsection for the provision of 36 37 services which are a part of the basic education program required by Article IX, section 3 of the state Constitution. 38

- 1 (5) Employee benefit plans offered by any district shall comply 2 with RCW 28A.400.350 and 28A.400.275 and 28A.400.280.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** (1) The professional development program is The professional development program shall provide 4 established. 5 certificated instructional staff opportunities to: Develop and update student learning improvement plans; implement curriculum materials and 6 7 instructional strategies; implement the selected curricula and 8 instruction; and develop and implement assessment strategies and training in assessment scoring. The professional development program 9 may also fund other activities intended to improve student learning for 10 all students, including students with diverse needs. 11 undertaken with funding provided for the professional development 12 program shall be: Consistent with the school or district improvement 13 14 plan; designed to improve the ability of teachers, and other instructional certificated and classified staff, to assist students in 15 meeting the essential academic learning requirements; and designed to 16 achieve state and local accountability goals. School districts shall 17 18 conduct professional development program training on days other than 19 student in-class days as designated by the school calendar.
- 20 (2) The professional development program established by this 21 section is not within the program of basic education. Stipends 22 provided through the professional development program are not basic 23 education program salaries under RCW 28A.400.200.
- 24 (3) If the legislature revokes any benefits granted under this 25 section, no affected employee is entitled to receive the benefits as a 26 matter of contractual right.
- 27 (4) The professional development program terminates at the end of 28 the 2000-01 school year.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect July 1, 1999.
