14 The appropriations in this section are subject to the following 15 conditions and limitations:

- (1) Pursuant to RCW 7.68.015, the department shall operate the 16 17 crime victims compensation program within the public safety and education account funds appropriated in this section. 18 In the event 19 that cost containment measures are necessary, the department may (a) 20 institute copayments for services; (b) develop preferred provider and managed care contracts; (c) coordinate with the department of social 21 22 and health services to use the public safety and education account as 23 matching funds for federal Title XIX reimbursement, to the extent this maximizes total funds available for services to crime victims. 24
- (2) \$123,000 of the accident account--state appropriation and \$22,000 of the medical aid account--state appropriation are provided solely for the implementation of Engrossed Senate Bill No. 5597 (needle stick protection). If the bill is not enacted by June 30, 1999, the amounts provided in this subsection shall lapse.
- 30 (3) \$302,000 of the accident account--state appropriation and \$302,000 of the medical aid account--state appropriation are provided solely for the implementation of Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill No. 5439 (false claims). If the bill is not enacted by June 30, 1999, the amounts provided in this subsection shall lapse.
- 35 (4) \$709,000 of the accident account--state appropriation and 36 \$709,000 of the medical aid account--state appropriation are provided 37 solely for the implementation of Engrossed Senate Bill No. 5580 38 (payments during appeals). If the bill is not enacted by June 30, 39 1999, the amounts provided in this subsection shall lapse.

- 1 (5) \$481,000 of the medical aid account--state appropriation is 2 provided solely for the implementation of Engrossed Substitute Senate 3 Bill No. 5470 (chemically related illnesses). If the bill is not 4 enacted by June 30, 1999, the amount provided in this subsection shall 5 lapse.
- 6 (6) \$5,000,000 of the medical aid account--state appropriation is 7 provided solely for implementation of Engrossed House Bill No. 2232 8 (occupational safety and health grants). If the bill is not enacted by 9 June 30, 1999, the amount provided in this subsection shall lapse.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect July 1, 1999.
