- 1 AN ACT Relating to election dates for a first class city that
- 2 changes its form of government; and amending RCW 29.13.020.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 29.13.020 and 1994 c 142 s 2 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) All city, town, and district general elections shall be held 7 throughout the state of Washington on the first Tuesday following the 8 first Monday in November in the odd-numbered years.
- 9 This section shall not apply to:
- 10 (a) Elections for the recall of any elective public officer;
- 11 (b) Public utility districts or district elections at which the
- 12 ownership of property within those districts is a prerequisite to
- 13 voting, all of which elections shall be held at the times prescribed in
- 14 the laws specifically applicable thereto;
- 15 (c) Consolidation proposals as provided for in RCW 28A.315.280 and
- 16 nonhigh capital fund aid proposals as provided for in chapter 28A.540
- 17 RCW.
- 18 (2) The county auditor, as ex officio supervisor of elections, upon
- 19 request in the form of a resolution of the governing body of a city,

- 1 town, or district, presented to the auditor at least forty-five days
- 2 prior to the proposed election date, may, if the county auditor deems
- 3 an emergency to exist, call a special election in such city, town, or
- 4 district, and for the purpose of such special election he or she may
- 5 combine, unite, or divide precincts. Except as provided in subsection
- 6 $((\frac{3}{3}))$ (4) of this section, such a special election shall be held on
- 7 one of the following dates as decided by the governing body:
- 8 (a) The first Tuesday after the first Monday in February;
- 9 (b) The second Tuesday in March;
- 10 (c) The fourth Tuesday in April;
- 11 (d) The third Tuesday in May;
- 12 (e) The day of the primary election as specified by RCW 29.13.070;

- 14 (f) The first Tuesday after the first Monday in November.
- 15 (3) The county auditor, as ex officio supervisor of elections, upon
- 16 request in the form of a resolution of the governing body of a first
- 17 class city, presented to the auditor at least forty-five days prior to
- 18 the proposed election date, may call a special election on one of the
- 19 dates described in subsection (2) of this section as decided by the
- 20 governing body in such city, for the purpose of electing new municipal
- 21 officers as a result of an election to change its form of government.
- 22 <u>(4)</u> In a presidential election year, if a presidential preference
- 23 primary is conducted in February, March, April, or May under chapter
- 24 29.19 RCW, the date on which a special election may be called under
- 25 subsection (2) of this section during the month of that primary is the
- 26 date of the presidential primary.
- 27 (((4))) (5) In addition to subsection (2)(a) through (f) of this
- 28 section, a special election to validate an excess levy or bond issue
- 29 may be called at any time to meet the needs resulting from fire, flood,
- 30 earthquake, or other act of God, except that no special election may be
- 31 held between the first day for candidates to file for public office and
- of the secure of
- 32 the last day to certify the returns of the general election other than
- as provided in subsection (2)(e) and (f) of this section. Such special
- 34 election shall be conducted and notice thereof given in the manner

- (((5))) (6) This section shall supersede the provisions of any and
- 37 all other statutes, whether general or special in nature, having
- 38 different dates for such city, town, and district elections, the
