- 1 AN ACT Relating to changing references to the Washington
- 2 archaeological research center to the office of archaeology and
- 3 historic preservation; and amending RCW 27.53.020, 27.53.070, and
- 4 27.53.080.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 **Sec. 1.** RCW 27.53.020 and 1986 c 266 s 16 are each amended to read 7 as follows:
- 8 The discovery, identification, excavation, and study of the state's
- 9 archaeological resources, the providing of information on
- 10 archaeological sites for their nomination to the state and national
- 11 registers of historic places, the maintaining of a complete inventory
- 12 of archaeological sites and collections, and the providing of
- 13 information to state, federal, and private construction agencies
- 14 regarding the possible impact of construction activities on the state's
- 15 archaeological resources, are proper public functions; and the
- 16 ((Washington archaeological research center)) office of archaeology and
- 17 <u>historic preservation</u>, created ((under the authority of)) <u>in</u> chapter
- 18 ((39.34)) 27.34 RCW ((as now existing or hereafter amended)), is hereby
- 19 designated as an appropriate agency to carry out these functions. The

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- 1 director, in consultation with the ((Washington archaeological research
- 2 center)) office of archaeology and historic preservation, shall provide
- 3 guidelines for the selection of depositories designated by the state
- 4 for archaeological resources. The legislature directs that there shall
- 5 be full cooperation amongst the department, the ((Washington
- 6 archaeological research center)) office of archaeology and historic
- 7 preservation, and other agencies of the state.
- 8 **Sec. 2.** RCW 27.53.070 and 1975-'76 2nd ex.s. c 82 s 3 are each 9 amended to read as follows:
- It is the declared intention of the legislature that field 10 investigations on privately owned lands should be discouraged except in 11 12 accordance with both the provisions and spirit of this chapter and persons having knowledge of the location of archaeological sites or 13 14 resources are encouraged to communicate such information to the 15 ((Washington archaeological research center)) office of archaeology and 16 historic preservation. Such information shall not constitute a public record which requires disclosure pursuant to the exception authorized 17 18 in RCW 42.17.310, as now or hereafter amended, to avoid site 19 depredation.
- 20 **Sec. 3.** RCW 27.53.080 and 1986 c 266 s 19 are each amended to read 21 as follows:
- 22 Qualified or professional archaeologists, in performance of their 23 duties, are hereby authorized to enter upon public lands of the state 24 of Washington and its political subdivisions, at such times and in such 25 manner as not to interfere with the normal management thereof, for the purposes of doing archaeological resource location and evaluation 26 27 studies, including site sampling activities. Scientific excavations 28 are to be carried out only after appropriate agreement has been made 29 between a professional archaeologist or an institution of higher education and the agency or political subdivision responsible for such 30 31 lands. Notice of such agreement shall be filed with the ((Washington 32 archaeological research center)) office of archaeology and historic 33 preservation and by them to the department. Amateur societies may engage in such activities by submitting and having approved by the 34 35 responsible agency or political subdivision a written proposal detailing the scope and duration of the activity. Before approval, a 36 37 proposal from an amateur society shall be submitted to the ((Washington

- 2 preservation for review and recommendation.

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
