1 AN ACT Relating to the citizens' alliance for government 2 accountability; adding new sections to chapter 43.131 RCW; adding a new 3 chapter to Title 43 RCW; making an appropriation; and declaring an 4 emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The legislature finds that the state of 7 Washington is nationally recognized in the areas of financial management, capital management, human resources, and managing for 8 9 results and information technology; that the executive branch of state 10 government has undertaken regulatory reform efforts, performance-based budgeting efforts, and programs to improve quality, efficiency, and 11 12 effectiveness; and that the roles performed by the legislative auditor 13 and the state auditor are valued.

It is the intent of the legislature that public confidence in government at all levels is essential and must be promoted by all possible means, that the state's stewardship over public funds is a fundamental responsibility, and that this chapter is designed to help strengthen state management of public resources and the systems that

provide citizens the information they need to assess accountability and
 to make informed decisions.

3 The purposes of this chapter are to:

4 (1) Establish a permanent means of bringing citizens, public
5 employees, policymakers, executives, businesses, labor organizations,
6 and management experts together for the continuous enhancement of state
7 government and agency performance and accountability and to make our
8 Washington state government and its agencies the most effective and
9 efficient in the nation;

(2) Assess the quality and integration of state agency strategic
 and quality plans, performance measurement, and performance assessment
 in planning, budgeting, and managing the state's resources;

(3) Evaluate whether state government and its agencies make
strategic and consistent efforts to engage citizens in dialogue,
planning, and determining accountability for programs and services;

16 (4) Determine whether citizens have the information they need to 17 assess accountability and adequate opportunities to participate in 18 their government;

(5) Assess the success of state agencies implementing and using new
 technologies to improve services, facilitate citizen access, and
 measure and enhance the satisfaction of state agency customers;

(6) Evaluate the effectiveness of state agencies publicizingperformance results and successes;

(7) Use independent and comprehensive reviews to affirm the
 effectiveness and efficiency of state government agency management and
 use of public resources; and

(8) Establish benchmarks of the best practices of government at all
levels in organizing, managing, and conducting the annual, independent
reviews of the effectiveness and efficiency of state government agency
management and use of public resources.

Sec. 2. The citizens' alliance for government 31 NEW SECTION. 32 accountability is established as a panel composed of six members as 33 follows: (1) The governor or the governor's designee; (2) the state 34 auditor or the state auditor's designee; and (3) four citizen members, one of which is appointed by the leader of each of the two major party 35 36 caucuses of the house of representatives and the senate. The members of the alliance shall select a chair from one of the four citizen 37 members. The alliance shall appoint task forces as needed that reflect 38

1 the state's economic, social, ethnic, and political diversity, 2 including private sector, for-profit, corporate chief executive 3 officers, private sector, nonprofit organization chief executives, 4 state employees, representatives of a labor organization, management 5 experts, managers or administrators from county or city government, and 6 the general citizenry.

7 Volunteers shall be sought to participate. The alliance may create
8 subcommittees and advisory panels to assist in its deliberations and
9 may contract for specialized expertise.

10 The alliance may solicit charitable gifts, grants, and donations 11 that are placed into the citizens' alliance for government 12 accountability account and used to offset general fund moneys 13 appropriated for such purposes.

All members of the alliance shall be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred in the performance of duties of the alliance in accordance with RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

Sec. 3. The alliance shall make reports and 17 NEW SECTION. 18 recommendations to increase and improve state government efficiency, effectiveness, organization, operations, and accountability and to 19 By December 31, 2000, the alliance shall 20 achieve costs savings. present the legislature and governor with a strategic work plan to 21 accomplish its purposes and shall make annual reports to the 22 23 legislature and governor thereafter.

24 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. The citizens' alliance for government accountability account is created in the custody of the state 25 treasurer. Expenditures from the account may only be expended to 26 27 finance the activities of the alliance and all expenditures must be 28 authorized by the director of the office of financial management or the 29 director's designee. Moneys in the account are not subject to appropriation and are not subject to the allotment procedures under 30 31 chapter 43.88 RCW.

32 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. The alliance shall convene summit 33 conferences as needed throughout the state and shall actively solicit 34 participation by state employees, management experts, and the general 35 citizenry.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 43.131 RCW
 to read as follows:

The citizens' alliance for government accountability and its powers and duties shall terminate on June 30, 2007, as provided in section 7 of this act.

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. A new section is added to chapter 43.131 RCW 7 to read as follows:

8 The following acts or parts of acts, as now existing or hereafter 9 amended, are each repealed, effective June 30, 2008:

10 (1) Section 1 of this act;

11 (2) Section 2 of this act;

12 (3) Section 3 of this act;

13 (4) Section 4 of this act;

14 (5) Section 5 of this act; and

15 (6) Section 10 of this act.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 8. Sections 1 through 5 and 10 of this act 17 constitute a new chapter in Title 43 RCW.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 9. The sum of two hundred thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the biennium ending June 30, 2001, from the state general fund to the citizens' alliance for government accountability account for the purposes of this act.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 10. This act is necessary for the immediate 24 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 25 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 26 immediately.

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
