- 1 AN ACT Relating to studying the impacts of state employee
- 2 collective bargaining; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) The joint legislative audit and review
- 5 committee shall conduct a review of state employee collective
- 6 bargaining, comparing the collective bargaining system in this state
- 7 with systems in other states. The committee's review shall include,
- 8 but is not limited to:
- 9 (a) The history and development of collective bargaining systems
- 10 for state employees, including:
- 11 (i) The relationship of collective bargaining systems to civil
- 12 service protections for state employees and the impacts of the systems
- 13 on classified state employees not represented by labor organizations;
- 14 (ii) The impacts of collective bargaining systems on state employee
- 15 labor relations and resolution of labor disputes; and
- 16 (iii) The role of the legislative and executive branches in
- 17 overseeing state employee collective bargaining;

- 1 (b) The economic consequences for states that have collective 2 bargaining over compensation issues for state employees, including the 3 impact on salary increases and fringe benefit packages; and
- (c) The projected budgetary implications for this state, including the impact on the legislature's appropriation authority and the budget cycles, if wage bargaining for state employees were to be permitted, based on information from states with wage bargaining for state employees.
- 9 (2) The joint legislative audit and review committee may contract 10 for services to conduct the review required by this section.
- 11 (3) The joint legislative audit and review committee shall report 12 its findings and recommendations to the appropriate committees of the 13 legislature by December 1, 2000.
