- 1 AN ACT Relating to fire sprinkler systems; and amending RCW
- 2 18.160.030 and 18.160.040.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.160.030 and 1992 c 116 s 2 are each amended to read 5 as follows:
- 6 (1) This chapter shall be administered by the state director of 7 fire protection.
- 8 (2) The state director of fire protection shall have the authority,
- 9 and it shall be his or her duty to:
- 10 (a) Issue such administrative regulations as necessary for the 11 administration of this chapter;
- 12 (b)(i) Set reasonable fees for licenses, certificates, testing, and
- 13 other aspects of the administration of this chapter. However, the
- 14 license fee for fire protection sprinkler system contractors engaged
- 15 solely in the installation, inspection, maintenance, or servicing of
- 16 NFPA 13-D fire protection sprinkler systems shall not exceed one
- 17 hundred dollars, and the license fee for fire protection sprinkler
- 18 system contractors engaged solely in the installation, inspection,

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- 1 maintenance, or servicing of NFPA 13-R fire protection sprinkler 2 systems shall not exceed three hundred dollars;
- (ii) Adopt rules establishing a special category restricted to contractors registered under chapter 18.27 RCW who install underground systems that service fire protection sprinkler systems((. The rules shall be adopted within ninety days of March 31, 1992));
 - (c) Enforce the provisions of this chapter;

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- 8 (d) Conduct investigations of complaints to determine if any 9 infractions of this chapter or the regulations developed under this 10 chapter have occurred;
- 11 (e) ((Work with the fire sprinkler advisory committee consisting of 12 fire protection sprinkler system contractors and other related 13 officials;
- (f)) Assign a certificate number to each certificate of competency holder; ((and
- (g)) (f) Adopt rules necessary to implement and administer a program which requires the affixation of a seal any time a fire protection sprinkler system is installed, which seal shall include the certificate number of any certificate of competency holder who installs, in whole or in part, the fire protection sprinkler system;
- 21 (g) Adopt rules necessary for the collection of fees established in 22 the uniform building code for conducting plan reviews and inspections 23 when requested by local jurisdictions, subject to available funds and 24 resources; and
- 25 (h) Adopt rules necessary to assess monetary penalties of a civil 26 nature for the violation of the provisions of this chapter.
- 27 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.160.040 and 1990 c 177 s 5 are each amended to read 28 as follows:
- 29 (1) To become a certificate of competency holder under this 30 chapter, an applicant must have satisfactorily passed an examination administered by the state director of fire protection. A certificate 31 of competency holder can satisfy this examination requirement by 32 33 presenting a copy of a current certificate of competency from the national institute for certification in engineering technologies 34 showing that the applicant has achieved the classification of 35 36 engineering technician level 3 or senior engineering technician level 4 in the field of fire protection, automatic sprinkler system layout. 37 ((The state director of fire protection may accept equivalent proof of 38

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qualification in lieu of examination, as recommended by the fire sprinkler advisory committee.)) This examination requirement is mandatory except as otherwise provided in this chapter.

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- 4 (2) Every applicant for a certificate of competency shall fulfill the requirements established by the state director of fire protection ((and the fire protection sprinkler system technical advisory committee under chapter 34.05 RCW)).
 - (3) Every applicant for a certificate of competency shall make application to the state director of fire protection and pay the fees required.
 - (4) Provided the application for the certificate of competency is made prior to ninety days after May 1, 1991, the state director of fire protection, in lieu of the examination requirements of the applicant for a certificate of competency, may accept as satisfactory evidence of competency and qualification, affidavits attesting that the applicant has had a minimum of three years' experience.
- 17 (5) The state director of fire protection may((, after consultation with the fire sprinkler advisory committee,)) issue a temporary 18 19 certificate of competency to an applicant who, in his or her judgment, 20 will satisfactorily perform as a certificate of competency holder under the provisions of this chapter. 21 The temporary certificate of competency shall remain in effect for a period of up to three years. 22 The temporary certificate of competency holder shall, within the three-23 24 year period, complete the examination requirements specified in 25 subsection (1) of this section. There shall be no examination exemption for an 26 individual issued a temporary certificate of competency. Prior to the expiration of the three-year period, the 27 temporary certificate of competency holder shall make application for 28 29 a regular certificate of competency. The procedures and qualifications 30 for issuance of a regular certificate of competency shall be applicable to the temporary certificate of competency holder. When a temporary 31 certificate of competency expires, the holder shall cease all 32 activities associated with the holding of a temporary certificate of 33 competency, subject to the penalties contained in this chapter. 34
- 35 (6) To become a licensed fire protection sprinkler system contractor under this chapter, a person or firm must comply with the 36 37 following:
- (a) Must be or have in his or her full-time employ a holder of a 38 39 valid certificate of competency;

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- 1 (b) Comply with the minimum insurance requirements of this chapter; 2 and
- 3 (c) Make application to the state director of fire protection for 4 a license and pay the fees required.
- 5 (7) Each license and certificate of competency issued under this 6 chapter must be posted in a conspicuous place in the fire protection 7 sprinkler system contractor's place of business.

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- (8) All bids, advertisements, proposals, offers, and installation drawings for fire protection sprinkler systems must prominently display the fire protection sprinkler system contractor's license number.
- 11 (9) A certificate of competency or license issued under this 12 chapter is not transferable.
- (10) In no case shall a certificate of competency holder be 13 14 employed full time by more than one fire protection sprinkler system 15 contractor at the same time. If the certificate of competency holder should leave the employment of the fire protection sprinkler system 16 17 contractor, he or she must notify the state director of fire protection within thirty days. If the certificate of competency holder should 18 19 leave the employment of the fire protection sprinkler contractor, the contractor shall have six months or until the 20 expiration of the current license, whichever occurs last, to submit a 21 new application identifying another certificate of competency holder 22 who is at the time of application an owner of the fire protection 23 24 sprinkler system business or a full-time employee of the fire 25 protection sprinkler system contractor, in order to be issued a new 26 license. If such application is not received and a new license issued within the allotted time, the state director of fire protection shall 27 revoke the license of the fire protection sprinkler system contractor. 28

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
