1 AN ACT Relating to increasing work-based training at state 2 educational institutions; and creating new sections.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 The legislature finds that work-based NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. 5 learning is the best method for training institutions to offer relevant technical skills and provide students an understanding of the world of 6 7 work. Because of the costs associated with the high faculty-to-student ratio involved in work-based learning, community and technical colleges 8 9 find it difficult to offer such learning opportunities and their 10 availability is limited. Only four percent of community and technical college students participate in a degree or certificate program with a 11 12 work-based component. It is the intent of the legislature to increase 13 the capacity of the state's community and technical colleges to defray 14 extraordinary costs of work-based the learning in high-demand 15 vocational-technical fields.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. The state board for community and technical 17 colleges shall provide a bonus to community and technical colleges for

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1 each full-time equivalent student enrolled in a vocational-technical

2 degree or certificate program with a work-based learning component.

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
