HOUSE JOINT MEMORIAL 4000

1 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF 2 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 3 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:

We, your Memorialists, the House of Representatives and the Senate
of the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled,
respectfully represent and petition as follows:

7 WHEREAS, The United Nations has promoted a Biosphere Program 8 throughout the world; and

9 WHEREAS, The United Nations Cultural, Educational, and Scientific 10 Organization, UNESCO, has created a worldwide system of three hundred 11 twenty-eight Biosphere Reserves in eighty-two nations; and

12 WHEREAS, Forty-seven United Nations-designated Biosphere Reserves 13 are within the sovereign borders of the United States, and one United 14 Nations-designated Biosphere Reserve is within the State of Washington; 15 and

16 WHEREAS, Neither the Washington State Legislature nor the Congress 17 of the United States has considered, debated, or approved such 18 designations; and

19 WHEREAS, The Olympic National Park has already been designated as 20 a Biosphere Reserve; and 1 WHEREAS, None of the current area included within the Biosphere 2 Program in the State of Washington has been included at the request of 3 or with the consent of the Washington State Legislature; and

WHEREAS, The Washington State Legislature does not believe that a
request from the National Park Service should be adequate to nominate
land in the State of Washington as a Biosphere Reserve;

7 NOW, THEREFORE, The Washington State Legislature is unalterably 8 opposed to the inclusion of any land within the borders of the state 9 within the purview of the Biodiversity Treaty or any biodiversity 10 program without the express consent of the Washington State 11 Legislature, as provided by the United States Constitution and the 12 Washington State Constitution.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the Washington State Legislature urge the 13 14 members of the Congress of the United States, and especially the 15 Washington delegation to the Congress of the United States, to oppose inclusion of any land within the State of Washington in any Biosphere 16 Program of the United Nations without the express consent of the 17 Washington State Legislature in the form of enacted legislation; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately transmitted to the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker 20 of the House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the 21

22 State of Washington.
