1 AN ACT Relating to the western interstate commission for higher 2 education western undergraduate exchange program; amending RCW 3 28B.15.910; adding a new section to chapter 28B.15 RCW; and creating a 4 new section.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

6 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that policies that 7 encourage regional planning and access to higher education benefit both 8 the students and the state. Such policies improve access, reduce 9 unnecessary duplication, and make higher education more cost-effective. 10 The western undergraduate exchange program, coordinated by the western interstate commission for higher education is a program through which 11 12 students in participating states may enroll in designated institutions 13 in other participating states at a special, reduced tuition level. 14 During the 1998-99 school year institutions in fifteen western states 15 participated in the western undergraduate exchange program, including 16 Washington's bordering states of Oregon and Idaho. Eastern Washington 17 University participated on a pilot basis. It is the intent of the legislature to permit Washington's institutions of higher education to 18 19 participate in the western undergraduate exchange program.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 28B.15 RCW
to read as follows:

3 Subject to the limitations of RCW 28B.15.910, the governing boards 4 of Washington State University, Eastern Washington University, and 5 Central Washington University may waive all or a portion of the 6 difference between fifty percent of the resident tuition and fees 7 amount and the nonresident tuition fees differential for nonresident 8 students who enroll under the western interstate commission for higher 9 education western undergraduate exchange program.

10 **Sec. 3.** RCW 28B.15.910 and 1998 c 346 s 904 are each amended to 11 read as follows:

12 (1) Except for revenue waived under programs listed in subsections 13 (3) and (4) of this section, and unless otherwise expressly provided in 14 the omnibus state appropriations act, the total amount of operating fees revenue waived, exempted, or reduced by a state university, a 15 16 regional university, The Evergreen State College, or the community colleges as a whole, shall not exceed the percentage of total gross 17 18 authorized operating fees revenue ((set forth below)) in this subsection. As used in this section, "gross authorized operating fees 19 revenue" means the estimated gross operating fees revenue as estimated 20 under RCW 82.33.020 or as revised by the office of financial 21 management, before granting any waivers.
