- 1 TO THE HONORABLE WILLIAM J. CLINTON, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED
- 2 STATES, AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE
- 3 OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
- 4 THE UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED:
- 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 7 represent and petition as follows:
- 8 WHEREAS, Strokes are the leading cause of death in the United
- 9 States of America; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Strokes are also the leading cause of disability in the
- 11 United States; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The American Heart Association estimates that in this year
- 13 alone in the United States approximately six hundred thousand strokes
- 14 will occur, and that approximately two hundred thousand deaths will
- 15 ensue as a result of these strokes; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The incidence of stroke in young people is increasing in
- 17 the United States; and
- 18 WHEREAS, African-Americans have the highest incidence of stroke of
- 19 any segment of the population in the United States; and
- 20 WHEREAS, While the ability to treat strokes in the last decade has
- 21 increased significantly in the United States, a great deal of work must

- 1 still be done, especially in the areas of diagnosis, emergency
- 2 treatment, and prevention; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Awareness of stroke risk and symptoms needs to be
- 4 heightened among all Americans so that we will be alert to this risk;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, Although it is the third leading cause of death in the
- 7 United States, stroke risk in 1998 received the least amount of federal
- 8 research funds of the five major diseases; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The American Heart Association is launching a nine-month,
- 10 concerted effort to alert members of Congress about the urgent need and
- 11 responsibility for more funding for stroke research;
- 12 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the
- 13 members of Congress increase federal funding for stroke research.
- BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately
- 15 transmitted to the Honorable William J. Clinton, President of the
- 16 United States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker
- 17 of the House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the
- 18 State of Washington.
