- 1 TO THE HONORABLE WILLIAM J. CLINTON, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED
- 2 STATES, AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE
- 3 OF REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
- 4 THE UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, AND TO THE HONORABLE SLADE
- 5 GORTON AND THE HONORABLE PATTY MURRAY, UNITED STATES SENATORS, AND TO
- 6 THE MEMBERS OF THE WASHINGTON STATE DELEGATION IN CONGRESS:
- 7 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of
- 8 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully
- 9 represent and petition as follows:
- 10 WHEREAS, Prostate cancer, second only to lung cancer, is the
- 11 leading cause of death among men; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society estimates that, in 1998 in the
- 13 United States, approximately 185,000 new cases of prostate cancer will
- 14 be diagnosed and that approximately 39,000 prostate cancer-related
- 15 deaths occurred; and
- 16 WHEREAS, With an estimated 9,000,000 men currently afflicted, the
- 17 prevalence of prostate cancer makes it epidemic in the United States;
- 18 and
- 19 WHEREAS, African-American men in the United States have the highest
- 20 incidence of prostate cancer of any population in the world; and

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1 WHEREAS, The number of prostate cancer cases diagnosed has increased significantly over the past 35 years, partly as a result of 2 3 the widespread use of improved screening techniques, including 4 screening for the prostate specific antigen; and

5 WHEREAS, Awareness needs to be strengthened among men aged 40 and older to alert them to the risk of prostate cancer; and

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7 WHEREAS, Prostate cancer research is woefully underfunded. Significantly more research is needed to determine the causes and most 9 effective treatment for prostate cancer. In 1998, though it comprised 20% of all new cancer cases, excluding skin cancer, prostate cancer 10 received less than 4% of federal cancer research funds; and 11

WHEREAS, The National Prostate Cancer Coalition, a network of 12 13 prostate cancer patients advocates and supporting organizations, has presented more than 500,000 signatures to Congress and the President 14 urging increased research funding for prostate cancer;

16 NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that Congress 17 and the President provide increased funding for prostate cancer research. 18

19 BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately transmitted to the Honorable William J. Clinton, President of the 20 United States, the Honorable Slade Gorton, the Honorable Patty Murray, 21 the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the House of 22 Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of 23 24 Washington.

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
