5 DONATIONS OF EMPLOYEE LEAVE. During the 1999-2001 fiscal biennium, an employee of the Washington state department of transportation may, 6 7 consistent with the provisions of RCW 41.04.665(3), donate leave to the 8 existing leave balances of an employee of the Washington state 9 department of transportation who dies in the line of duty between February 1, 2000, and June 30, 2000. The value of the donated leave 10 will be included in the deceased employee's final compensation, but is 11 12 not compensation earnable for the purposes of chapter 41.40 RCW. agency head shall determine the total amount of leave, not to exceed 13 14 261 days, that may be donated under this section. The Washington 15 personnel resources board may adopt rules, in consultation with the 16 office of financial management, as it deems necessary for the 17 implementation of this temporary benefit.
