- 1 AN ACT Relating to the state toxicology laboratory; amending RCW
- 2 43.103.010, 43.103.020, 43.103.030, 43.103.090, 43.43.670, and
- 3 68.50.107; reenacting and amending RCW 66.08.180; creating a new
- 4 section; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** (1) All powers, duties, and functions of
- 7 the state toxicology laboratory are transferred to the bureau of
- 8 forensic laboratory services of the Washington state patrol.
- 9 (2)(a) All reports, documents, surveys, books, records, files,
- 10 papers, or written material in the possession of either the state
- 11 toxicology laboratory or the state toxicologist pertaining to the
- 12 powers, functions, and duties transferred shall be delivered to the
- 13 custody of the Washington state patrol. All cabinets, furniture,
- 14 office equipment, motor vehicles, and other tangible property employed
- 15 by the state toxicology laboratory or the state toxicologist in
- 16 carrying out the powers, functions, and duties transferred shall be
- 17 delivered into the custody of the Washington state patrol. All funds,
- 18 credits, or other assets held in connection with the powers, functions,

- 1 and duties transferred shall be assigned to the Washington state 2 patrol.
- 3 (b) Any appropriations made to the state toxicology laboratory or 4 the state toxicologist for carrying out the powers, functions, and 5 duties transferred shall, on the effective date of this section, be 6 transferred and credited to the Washington state patrol to carry out 7 the responsibilities of the bureau of forensic laboratory services 8 under RCW 43.43.670.
- 9 (c) Whenever any question arises as to the transfer of any personnel, funds, books, documents, records, papers, files, equipment, or other tangible property used or held in the exercise of the powers and the performance of the duties and functions transferred, the director of financial management shall make a determination as to the proper allocation and shall certify that determination to the state agencies concerned.
 - (3) All employees of the state toxicology laboratory engaged in performing the powers, functions, and duties of the state toxicology laboratory are transferred to the jurisdiction of the Washington state patrol. All employees classified under chapter 41.06 RCW, the state civil service law, are assigned to the Washington state patrol to perform their usual duties upon the same terms as formerly for the state toxicology laboratory, without any loss of rights, subject to any action that may be appropriate thereafter in accordance with the laws and rules governing state civil service.
- 25 (4) All rules and pending business before the state toxicologist 26 pertaining to the powers, functions, and duties transferred shall be 27 continued and acted upon by the Washington state patrol. All existing 28 contracts and obligations shall remain in full force and shall be 29 performed by the Washington state patrol.
- (5) The transfer of the powers, duties, functions, and personnel of the state toxicology laboratory shall not affect the validity of any act performed before the effective date of this section.
- 33 (6) If the apportionments of budgeted funds are required because of 34 the transfers directed by this section, the director of financial 35 management shall certify the apportionments to the agencies affected, 36 the state auditor, and the state treasurer. Each shall make the 37 appropriate transfer and adjustments in funds and appropriation 38 accounts and equipment records in accordance with the certification.

- 1 (7) Nothing contained in this section may be construed to alter any 2 existing collective bargaining unit or the provisions of any existing 3 collective bargaining agreement until the agreement has expired or 4 until the bargaining unit has been modified by action of the personnel 5 board as provided by law.
- 6 **Sec. 2.** RCW 43.103.010 and 1995 c 398 s 2 are each amended to read 7 as follows:
- 8 The purposes of this act are declared by the legislature to be as 9 follows:
- (1) To preserve and enhance the state crime laboratory <u>and state</u> toxicology laboratory, which ((is an)) <u>are</u> essential parts of the criminal justice <u>and death investigation</u> systems in the state of Washington;

- (a) Prescribe qualifications for the position of director of the bureau of forensic laboratory services, after consulting with the chief of the Washington state patrol. The council shall submit to the chief of the Washington state patrol a list containing the names of up to three persons who the council believes meet its qualifications to serve as director of the bureau of forensic laboratory services. Minimum 26 qualifications for the director of the bureau of forensic laboratory services must include successful completion of a background investigation and polygraph examination. If requested by the chief of the Washington state patrol, the forensic investigations council shall submit one additional list of up to three persons who the forensic investigations council believes meet its qualifications. appointment must be from one of the lists of persons submitted by the forensic investigations council, and the director of the bureau of forensic laboratory services shall report to the office of the chief of the Washington state patrol;
 - (b) After consulting with the chief of the Washington state patrol and the director of the bureau of forensic laboratory services, the council shall appoint a toxicologist as state toxicologist, who shall report to the director of the bureau of forensic laboratory services.

The state forensic investigations council, after consulting with the chief of the Washington state patrol and director of the 22 23 bureau of forensic laboratory services, shall appoint a toxicologist as 24 state toxicologist, who shall report to the director of the bureau of 25 forensic laboratory services and the office of the chief of the ((The laboratory)) <u>Toxicological ser</u>vices Washington state patrol. 26 shall be funded by disbursement from the ((class H)) spirits, beer, and 27 wine restaurant license fees as provided in RCW 66.08.180 and by 28 29 appropriation from the death investigations account as provided in RCW 30 43.79.445.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 9. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect July 1, 1999.
