On page 9, after line 15, insert the following:

4 "(3) The legislative transportation committee shall form a working group to evaluate the feasibility of developing an alternative corridor 5 to Interstate 5 and Interstate 405 to expedite the movement of commerce 6 7 between the Canadian border, the central Puget Sound region, the south 8 Puget Sound region, and more southerly areas. The corridor would run from approximately the Canadian border in the north to approximately 9 Lewis county in the south. This alternative corridor analysis shall 10 address truck, rail, pipeline, and other utility needs for the 11 12 corridor, to determine the feasibility of financing and constructing such a corridor, taking into consideration: (a) Anticipated present 13 and future freight demand as well as freight traffic relief for 14 15 existing state highway and rail routes; (b) the potential for carrying general purpose traffic to provide relief for other state highway 16 17 routes; (c) a cost-benefit analysis detailing various funding possibilities, including federal funds and the use of charges and tolls 18 19 to fund construction and operation of the corridor as a utility corridor and a toll facility; (d) an analysis detailing possible right 20 of way locations, including but not limited to property donations, 21 trades, or credits between or among the public and private sector; and 22 (e) possible private sector, local, or other partnerships that may be 23 24 used to fund the project.

The working group shall report its findings to the full committee by December 15, 2002."

<u>EFFECT:</u> Directs the legislative transportation committee to form a working group to examine the development of an alternative north-south freight corridor running from Lewis County to the Canadian border.
