7 "Sec. 1. RCW 74.13.031 and 1999 c 267 s 8 are each amended to read 8 as follows:

9 The department shall have the duty to provide child welfare 10 services and shall:

(1) Develop, administer, supervise, and monitor a coordinated and
 comprehensive plan that establishes, aids, and strengthens services for
 the protection and care of runaway, dependent, or neglected children.

(2) Within available resources, recruit an adequate number of 14 prospective adoptive and foster homes, both regular and specialized, 15 16 i.e. homes for children of ethnic minority, including Indian homes for 17 Indian children, sibling groups, handicapped and emotionally disturbed, teens, pregnant and parenting teens, and annually report to the 18 19 governor and the legislature concerning the department's success in: 20 (a) Meeting the need for adoptive and foster home placements; (b) 21 reducing the foster parent turnover rate; (c) completing home studies for legally free children; and (d) implementing and operating the 22 23 passport program required by RCW 74.13.285. The report shall include a section entitled "Foster Home Turn-Over, Causes and Recommendations." 24

25 (3) Investigate complaints of any recent act or failure to act on 26 the part of a parent or caretaker that results in death, serious 27 physical or emotional harm, or sexual abuse or exploitation, or that presents an imminent risk of serious harm, and on the basis of the 28 findings of such investigation, offer child welfare services in 29 30 relation to the problem to such parents, legal custodians, or persons serving in loco parentis, and/or bring the situation to the attention 31 32 of an appropriate court, or another community agency: PROVIDED, That an investigation is not required of nonaccidental injuries which are 33 34 clearly not the result of a lack of care or supervision by the child's 35 parents, legal custodians, or persons serving in loco parentis. If the 36 investigation reveals that a crime against a child may have been

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committed, the department shall notify the appropriate law enforcement
 agency.

3 (4) Offer, on a voluntary basis, family reconciliation services to4 families who are in conflict.

5 (5) Monitor out-of-home placements, on a timely and routine basis, 6 to assure the safety, well-being, and quality of care being provided is 7 within the scope of the intent of the legislature as defined in RCW 8 74.13.010 and 74.15.010, and annually submit a report measuring the 9 extent to which the department achieved the specified goals to the 10 governor and the legislature.

(6) Have authority to accept custody of children from parents and 11 to accept custody of children from juvenile courts, where authorized to 12 13 do so under law, to provide child welfare services including placement for adoption, and to provide for the physical care of such children and 14 15 make payment of maintenance costs if needed. Except where required by Public Law 95-608 (25 U.S.C. Sec. 1915), no private adoption agency 16 which receives children for adoption from the department shall 17 discriminate on the basis of race, creed, or color when considering 18 19 applications in their placement for adoption.

20 (7) Have authority to provide temporary shelter to children who 21 have run away from home and who are admitted to crisis residential 22 centers.

(8) Have authority to purchase care for children; and shall follow in general the policy of using properly approved private agency services for the actual care and supervision of such children insofar as they are available, paying for care of such children as are accepted by the department as eligible for support at reasonable rates established by the department.

(9) Establish a children's services advisory committee which shall assist the secretary in the development of a partnership plan for utilizing resources of the public and private sectors, and advise on all matters pertaining to child welfare, licensing of child care agencies, adoption, and services related thereto. At least one member shall represent the adoption community.

(10) Have authority to provide continued foster care or group care
 for individuals from eighteen through twenty years of age to enable
 them to complete their high school or vocational school program.

(11) Have authority within funds appropriated for foster careservices to purchase care for Indian children who are in the custody of

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1 a federally recognized Indian tribe or tribally licensed child-placing 2 agency pursuant to parental consent, tribal court order, or state 3 juvenile court order; and the purchase of such care shall be subject to 4 the same eligibility standards and rates of support applicable to other 5 children for whom the department purchases care.

6 Notwithstanding any other provision of RCW 13.32A.170 through 7 13.32A.200 and 74.13.032 through 74.13.036, or of this section all 8 services to be provided by the department of social and health services 9 under subsections (4), (6), and (7) of this section, subject to the 10 limitations of these subsections, may be provided by any program 11 offering such services funded pursuant to Titles II and III of the 12 federal juvenile justice and delinquency prevention act of 1974.

(12) Within amounts appropriated for this specific purpose, provide preventive services to families with children that prevent or shorten the duration of an out-of-home placement.

16 (13) Have authority to provide independent living services to 17 youths, including individuals eighteen through twenty years of age, who 18 are or have been in foster care.

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW 20 to read as follows:

Independent living services include assistance in achieving basic 21 educational requirements such as a GED, enrollment in vocational and 22 23 technical training programs offered at the community and vocational 24 colleges, and obtaining and maintaining employment; and accomplishing 25 basic life skills such as money management, nutrition, preparing meals, and cleaning house. A baseline skill level in ability to function 26 productively and independently shall be determined at 27 entry. Performance shall be measured and must demonstrate improvement from 28 29 involvement in the program. Each recipient shall have a plan for achieving independent living skills by the time the recipient reaches 30 age twenty-one. The plan shall be written within the first thirty days 31 of placement and reviewed every ninety days. A recipient who fails to 32 33 consistently adhere to the elements of the plan shall be subject to 34 reassessment by the professional staff of the program and may be declared ineligible to receive services." 35
