- 23 The administration of the joint legislative audit and review
- 24 committee is subject to section 1 of this act.
- 25 **Sec. 3.** RCW 44.28.060 and 1996 c 288 s 7 are each amended to read
- 26 as follows:
- 27 The members of the joint committee shall form an executive
- 28 committee consisting of one member from each of the four major
- 29 political caucuses, which shall include a chair and a vice-chair. The
- 30 chair and vice-chair shall serve for a period not to exceed two years.
- 31 The chair and the vice-chair may not be members of the same political
- 32 party. The chair shall alternate between the members of the majority
- 33 parties in the senate and the house of representatives.

- Subject to section 1 of this act, the executive committee is 1 responsible for performing all general administrative and personnel 2 3 duties assigned to it in the rules and procedures adopted by the joint 4 committee, as well as other duties delegated to it by the joint committee. The executive committee shall recommend applicants for the 5 position of the legislative auditor to the membership of the joint 6 7 committee. The legislative auditor shall be hired with the approval of 8 a majority of the membership of the joint committee. Subject to 9 section 1 of this act, the executive committee shall set the salary of 10 the legislative auditor.
- 11 The joint committee shall adopt rules and procedures for its 12 orderly operation. The joint committee may create subcommittees to 13 perform duties under this chapter.
- 14 **Sec. 4.** RCW 44.28.065 and 1996 c 288 s 8 are each amended to read 15 as follows:
- 16 The legislative auditor shall:
- 17 (1) Establish and manage the office of the joint legislative audit 18 and review committee to carry out the functions of this chapter;
- (2) Direct the audit and review functions described in this chapter and ensure that performance audits are performed in accordance with the "Government Auditing Standards" published by the comptroller general of the United States as applicable to the scope of the audit;

- 7 The administration of the legislative transportation committee is 8 subject to section 1 of this act.
- 9 **Sec. 6.** RCW 44.40.015 and 1999 sp.s. c 1 s 617 are each amended to 10 read as follows:
- 11 The members of the legislative transportation committee shall form 12 an executive committee consisting of two members from each of the four major political caucuses, which will include the chair and vice-chair 13 14 of the legislative transportation committee. There will be four 15 alternates to the executive committee, one from each of the four major 16 political caucuses. Each alternate may represent a member from the 17 same political caucus from which they were chosen when that member is 18 absent, and have voting privileges during that absence.
- Subject to section 1 of this act, the executive committee is 19 responsible for performing all general administrative and personnel 20 duties assigned to it in the rules and procedures adopted by the 21 22 committee, determining the number of legislative transportation 23 committee staff, and other duties delegated to it by the committee. 24 Except when those responsibilities are assumed by the legislative transportation committee, and subject to section 1 of this act, the 25 26 executive committee is responsible for adopting interim work plans and 27 meeting schedules, approving all contracts signed on behalf of the 28 committee, and setting policies for legislative transportation 29 ((committee [committee])) committee staff utilization.

- The members of the legislative transportation committee and the house and senate transportation committees shall receive allowances while attending meetings of the committees or subcommittees and while engaged in other authorized business of the committees as provided in RCW 44.04.120 ((as now or hereafter amended)). Subject to section 1 of

- 15 is not appointed.

- 5 (2) The coordinator shall serve as the executive and administrative 6 head of the center, and shall assist the administrative committee in 7 managing the information processing and communications systems of the 8 legislature as directed by the administrative committee.

- 21 (4) Enter into contracts for (a) the sale, exchange, or acquisition 22 of equipment, supplies, services, and facilities required to carry out 23 the purposes of this chapter and (b) the distribution of legislative 24 information;
- 25 (5) Generally assist the systems committee in carrying out its 26 responsibilities under this chapter, as directed by the systems 27 committee."
