3 "NEW SECTION. Sec. I. It is the intent of the legislature to 4 determine how to increase the effectiveness of penalties in deterring 5 violations of the campaign finance and contribution limits, lobbying, 6 political advertising, and public official's financial affairs 7 reporting subdivisions of the public disclosure act, by increasing the 8 likelihood that violators will be uncovered and punished in a manner 9 and time frame most likely to create deterrence for violators while 10 increasing voluntary compliance and respect for the law. It is further 11 the intent of the legislature that the public disclosure act not be a 12 deterrent to public participation in political activities, especially 13 due to fear of unreasonable penalties and processes of enforcement.

14 NEW SECTION. Sec. II. There is hereby created the task force on the public disclosure commission, to investigate the operation and 15 16 budget of the public disclosure commission and to make recommendations 17 to the legislature for ways to increase the effectiveness of penalties 18 in deterring violations of the campaign finance and contribution 19 political advertising, and public official's limits, lobbying, 20 financial affairs reporting subdivisions of the public disclosure act. 21 The task force shall consist of the chair and ranking minority members 22 of the senate state and local government and house state government 23 committees or their designees, and four representatives of the public, 24 one each chosen by the legislative members of the task force. A ninth member shall be a member of the public disclosure commission, chosen by 25 26 the chair of the public disclosure commission. The task force shall 27 examine the operations and budget of the public disclosure commission 28 as they relate to enforcement of the campaign finance and contribution 29 limits, lobbying, political advertising, and public official's 30 financial affairs reporting subdivisions of the public disclosure act, 31 and shall before December 1, 2002, make recommendations to the senate

state and local government and house state government committees on 1 2 ways to increase the likelihood that violators will be uncovered and 3 punished in a manner and time frame most likely to create deterrence 4 for violators while increasing voluntary compliance and respect for the law, and not deter public participation in political activities, 5 especially due to fear of unreasonable penalties and processes of 6 7 enforcement. The task force may consider different levels of fines, 8 different manners of enforcement, and different structures for the 9 public disclosure commission, including a separation of the 10 recordkeeping and investigatory functions from the adjudicatory functions. The task force shall cease to exist on January 1, 2003." 11
