Eliminates the requirement that each county with a population of 8,000 or more employ a full-time road engineer.

#### **Background:**

The county legislative authority of each county with a population of 8,000 or more must employ a full-time county road engineer. The county legislative authority of each other county must employ a county engineer either on a full-time or part-time basis, or may contract with another county for the engineering services of a county road engineer from such other county.

## **Summary of Bill:**

The requirement that each county with a population of 8,000 or more employ a full-time road engineer is eliminated. Each county with a population of 8,000 or more may hire either a full-time or part-time road engineer, or may contract with another county for engineering services.

**Appropriation:** None.

Effective Date: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

**Testimony For:** This bill presents a logical means for counties to save money and be more efficient. It also allows more qualified engineers to be shared between counties.
