Brief Summary of Bill

Recognizes April 20 as a Washington state day of peace.

Background:

A variety of dates are recognized in Washington without being considered legal holidays. For example, August 7 is recognized as Purple Heart Day. April 16 is recognized as Mother Joseph Day, and September 4 is recognized as Marcus Whitman Day.

Summary of Bill:

House Bill Report

April 20 is recognized as a Washington State Day of Peace, but is not considered a legal holiday for any purposes.

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Not Requested.

Effective Date: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

Testimony For: Youthful constituents of Representative Simpson first proposed the idea of a state day of peace. These children created a web site and participated in a letter writing campaign to promote the idea. A day of peace was declared by the governor for one year, but this would make it every year.
