**Background:** The Washington Health Care Facilities Authority assists in the construction of modern, well-equipped, and reasonably priced health care facilities. The authority is authorized to issue bonds for the construction, purchase, acquisition, rental, or lease of health care facilities by participants. The authority is composed of the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the Insurance Commissioner, the Secretary of Health, and a member of the public. Under current law, only the Governor is authorized to designate an employee to act on his or her behalf when the Governor is absent from a meeting of the authority.

**Summary of Bill:** The Insurance Commissioner is also authorized to designate an employee to act on his or her behalf when the Insurance Commissioner is absent from a meeting of the authority.

**Appropriation:** None.

**Fiscal Note:** Not requested.

**Effective Date:** Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

**Testimony For:** This is a housekeeping bill. It is not always possible for members of the Health Care Facilities Authority to attend each scheduled meeting. This bill will allow someone from the Insurance Commissioner's Office to be present at every meeting of the authority.
