Title: An act relating to the sale of wine for off-premises consumption.

Brief Description: Allowing restaurants and private clubs to sell wine for off-premises consumption.

Background: Restaurants and private clubs that are holders of spirits, beer and wine–licenses currently do not have special license endorsements allowing them to sell exclusively-labeled wine and sparkling wine for off-premises consumption.

Summary of Bill: An endorsement is added to existing restaurant and private club liquor licenses to allow the sale of wine vinted and bottled in the state of Washington and sparkling wine from California to be sold for off-premises consumption, when the wine or sparkling wine is bottled and labeled exclusively for the restaurant or private club.

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Not requested.

Effective Date: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

Testimony For: This bill will help a limited number of facilities and will promote Washington State wines.
