Background: In cities and towns with populations of 400,000 or less, municipal court judges must be residents of the county in which the municipal court was created. Part-time appointed municipal court judges who do not appoint a court commissioner are exempt from this residency requirement.

The District and Municipal Court Judges' Association recommends revising the residency requirements in order to provide a uniform requirement for part-time municipal court judges.

Summary of Bill: If a city or town has a population of 400,000 or less, all municipal court judges, including part-time appointed municipal court judges who do not appoint a court commissioner, must be residents of the county where the court is located.

Appropriation: None.

Fiscal Note: Not requested.

Effective Date: Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

Testimony For: The current inconsistency in the residency requirements for part-time judges should be eliminated.
