**Background:** Currently the state is required to provide a standard serological test for syphilis, free of charge, to any physician or health care facility requesting it. Screening for syphilis, a bacterial venereal disease, is mandatory as part of prenatal exams. There are currently fewer than 100 active cases of syphilis in the state.

**Summary of Bill:** The State Department of Health is authorized to charge private physicians a fee for syphilis lab tests.

**Appropriation:** None.

**Fiscal Note:** Not requested.

**Effective Date:** Ninety days after adjournment of session in which bill is passed.

**Testimony For:** This is not an overly burdensome way of recovering some state costs.
