- 1 AN ACT Relating to information about ballot measures; amending
- 2 RCW 29.81.250; and adding a new section to chapter 29.79 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 29.79
- 5 RCW to read as follows:
- 6 The office of financial management, in consultation with the
- 7 secretary of state, shall prepare a fiscal impact statement for
- each of the following state ballot measures: (1) An initiative to 8
- the people that is certified to the ballot; (2) an initiative to 9
- 10 the legislature that will appear on the ballot; (3) an alternative
- measure appearing on the ballot that the legislature proposes to 11
- 12 an initiative to the legislature; (4) a referendum bill referred
- 13 to voters by the legislature; and (5) a referendum measure
- 14 appearing on the ballot. Fiscal impact statements must be written
- 15 in clear and concise language and avoid legal and technical terms
- when possible, and may include easily understood graphics. 16
- 17 A fiscal impact statement must describe any projected increase
- or decrease in revenues, costs, expenditures, or indebtedness that 18
- 19 the state or local governments will experience if the ballot

- 1 measure were approved by state voters. Where appropriate, a
- 2 fiscal impact statement may include both estimated dollar amounts
- 3 and a description placing the estimated dollar amounts into
- 4 context. A fiscal impact statement must include both a summary of
- 5 not to exceed one hundred words and a more detailed statement that
- 6 includes the assumptions that were made to develop the fiscal
- 7 impacts.
- 8 Fiscal impact statements must be available online from the
- 9 secretary of state's web site and included in the state voters'
- 10 pamphlet.
- 11 **Sec. 2.** RCW 29.81.250 and 1999 c 260 s 5 are each amended to read
- 12 as follows:
- 13 The secretary of state shall determine the format and layout of
- 14 the voters' pamphlet. The secretary of state shall print the
- 15 pamphlet in clear, readable type on a size, quality, and weight of
- 16 paper that in the judgment of the secretary of state best serves
- 17 the voters. The pamphlet must contain a table of contents.
- 18 Federal and state offices must appear in the pamphlet in the same
- 19 sequence as they appear on the ballot. Measures and arguments
- 20 must be printed in the order specified by RCW 29.79.300.
- 21 The voters' pamphlet must provide the following information for
- 22 each statewide issue on the ballot:
- 23 (1) The legal identification of the measure by serial
- 24 designation or number;
- 25 (2) The official ballot title of the measure;
- 26 (3) A statement prepared by the attorney general explaining the
- 27 law as it presently exists;
- 28 (4) A statement prepared by the attorney general explaining the
- 29 effect of the proposed measure if it becomes law;
- 30 (5) The fiscal impact statement prepared under section 1 of
- 31 this act;
- 32 (6) The total number of votes cast for and against the measure
- 33 in the senate and house of representatives, if the measure has
- 34 been passed by the legislature;
- (((6))) An argument advocating the voters' approval of the
- 36 measure together with any statement in rebuttal of the opposing
- 37 argument;

- $((\frac{7}{1}))$ (8) An argument advocating the voters' rejection of the 1 2 measure together with any statement in rebuttal of the opposing 3 argument; $((\frac{8}{1}))$ Each argument or rebuttal statement must be 4 followed by the names of the committee members who submitted them, 5 and may be followed by a telephone number that citizens may call 6 to obtain information on the ballot measure; 7 $((\frac{9}{10}))$ (10) The full text of each measure. 8
