- 1 AN ACT Relating to the quality of foster care services; amending
- 2 RCW 74.13.270; adding new sections to chapter 74.13 RCW; and
- 3 recodifying RCW 74.13.290, 74.14A.050, 74.13.320, 74.13.325,
- 4 74.14B.020, 74.13.250, 74.13.310, 74.13.260, 74.13.280, 74.13.285,
- 5 74.13.300, 74.13.330, 74.13.270, 74.13.315, 74.13.335, 74.13.340, and
- 6 74.14B.080.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW,
- 9 to be codified after RCW 74.13.230 under the subchapter heading "Foster
- 10 Care", to read as follows:
- 11 The legislature finds that children and youth in foster care
- 12 deserve to be provided with a safe, secure, and stable home along with
- 13 the compassion and nurture of a foster family. The legislature
- 14 recognizes that foster families open their homes and hearts to children
- 15 whose families are in crisis, play a vital role in helping children and
- 16 families heal and reconnect, and in launching children into successful
- 17 adulthood.
- 18 Children in foster care deserve to be in homes that meet high
- 19 quality standards that are assured through accountability. It is the

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- 1 intent of the legislature that children in foster care are supported in
- 2 homes that meet their needs, and that foster parents are supported.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW,
- 4 to be codified after RCW 74.13.010, to read as follows:
- 5 The legislature finds that accreditation by an independent entity
- 6 improves the quality of services provided to children and families.
- 7 Accreditation demonstrates an ongoing commitment to nationally
- 8 recognized standards of best practice in child welfare and provides
- 9 accountability for achieving outcome goals. Accreditation provides
- 10 assurance that the organization delivers effective services that meet
- 11 community needs.
- 12 Accreditation is a structured process designed to facilitate
- 13 organizational change and improvement. Accreditation means persons
- 14 served can expect greater participation in decisions that affect their
- 15 cases, improved case management and documentation, and improved
- 16 internal operations and accountability. Accreditation improves
- 17 relationships with biological parents, foster and adoptive parents,
- 18 providers, the courts, and members of the community.
- 19 The accreditation process promotes organizational improvement
- 20 through the application of several strategies, including but not
- 21 limited to:
- 22 (1) Appropriate caseworker ratios;
 - (2) Aggressive recruitment and retention of foster parents;
- 24 (3) Improved responsiveness to foster parents;
- 25 (4) Provision of appropriate reunification services to birth
- 26 families;

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- 27 (5) Development of positive outcome goals and compliance with
- 28 customer service standards; and
- 29 (6) Establishing the principle that all parts of the services
- 30 system will respond consistently, positively, and timely.
- 31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW,
- 32 to be codified after section 2 of this act, to read as follows:
- 33 In recognition of the value of accreditation in improving the child
- 34 welfare services system, the legislature supports the department's
- 35 efforts to seek full accreditation of all children's administration
- 36 offices and establishes a goal of achieving accreditation by an
- 37 independent entity by July 1, 2006.

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- 1 **Sec. 4.** RCW 74.13.270 and 1990 c 284 s 8 are each amended to read 2 as follows:
- 3 <u>(1)</u> The legislature recognizes the need for temporary short-term 4 relief for foster parents who care for children with emotional, mental,
- 5 or physical handicaps. For purposes of this section, respite care
- 6 means appropriate, temporary, short-term care for these foster children
- 7 placed with licensed foster parents. The purpose of this care is to
- 8 give the foster parents temporary relief from the stresses associated
- 9 with the care of these foster children.
- 10 (2) The legislature recognizes the need for respite care under
- 11 subsection (1) of this section for foster parents who care for children
- 12 in foster care placements longer than ninety days.
- 13 (3) The department shall design a program of respite care that will
- 14 minimize disruptions to the child and will serve foster parents within
- 15 these priorities, based on input from foster parents, foster parent
- 16 associations, and reliable research if available. The respite care
- 17 program shall provide that foster parents who care for children in
- 18 <u>foster care longer than ninety days will be eligible for at least three</u>
- 19 days of respite care per month per foster family.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW,
- 21 to be codified after RCW 74.13.325, to read as follows:
- The legislature recognizes that children and youth entering foster
- 23 care have more complex needs than in the past. New service models are
- 24 needed to address these needs. The department is instructed to explore
- 25 proven and effective foster care projects nationwide. The foster care
- 26 models should focus on increasing the recruitment and retention of
- 27 quality foster care settings, and, where appropriate, should focus on
- 28 the hardest to serve children in foster care. The department shall
- 29 report to the appropriate committees of the legislature by December 1,
- 30 2001, on models that most effectively serve the children in the state's
- 31 foster care system.
- 32 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** A new section is added to chapter 74.13 RCW
- 33 to read as follows:
- Nothing in this act shall be construed to create a private right of
- 35 action or claim on the part of any individual or entity.

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- 1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** RCW 74.13.290, 74.14A.050, 74.13.320, and
- 2 74.13.325 are each recodified as sections in chapter 74.13 RCW. These
- 3 recodified sections are to be placed after section 1 of this act.
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** RCW 74.14B.020, 74.13.250, 74.13.310,
- 5 74.13.260, 74.13.280, 74.13.285, 74.13.300, 74.13.330, 74.13.270,
- 6 74.13.315, 74.13.335, 74.13.340, and 74.14B.080 are each recodified as
- 7 sections in chapter 74.13 RCW. These recodified sections are to be
- 8 placed after section 5 of this act.

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
