NEW SECTION. Sec. 409. The department of transportation is authorized to undertake federal advance construction projects under the provisions of 23 U.S.C. Sec. 115 in order to maintain progress in meeting approved highway construction and preservation objectives. The legislature recognizes that the use of state funds may be required to temporarily fund expenditures of the federal appropriations for the highway construction and preservation programs for federal advance construction projects prior to conversion to federal funding.

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2 PROVISIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT APPROPRIATIONS

3 NEW SECTION. Sec. 501. As a management tool to reduce costs and 4 make more effective use of resources, while improving employee 5 productivity and morale, agencies may offer voluntary separation and/or downshifting incentives and options according to procedures and 6 7 guidelines established by the department of personnel the 8 department of retirement systems in consultation with the office of 9 financial management. The options may include, but are not limited to, 10 financial incentives for: Voluntary resignation and retirement, voluntary leave-without-pay, voluntary workweek or work hour reduction, 11 12 voluntary downward movement, or temporary separation for development 13 purposes.

Agencies shall report on the outcomes of their plans, and offers shall be reviewed and monitored jointly by the department of personnel, the department of retirement systems, and the office of personnel management for reporting to the office of financial management by December 1, 2002.

19 NEW SECTION. Sec. 502. It is the intent of the legislature that 20 agencies may implement a voluntary retirement incentive program that is 21 cost neutral or results in cost savings provided that such program is 22 approved by the directors of retirement systems, the office of personnel management, and the office of financial management. Agencies 23 24 participating in this authorization are required to submit a report by 25 June 30, 2003, to the legislature and the office of financial 26 management on the outcome of their approved retirement incentive 27 The report should include information on the details of the program. 28 including resulting service delivery changes, program 29 efficiencies, the cost of the retirement incentive per participant, the total cost to the state, and the projected or actual net dollar savings 30 31 over the 2001-2003 biennium.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 503. If any provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
