## SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1655

- 1 AN ACT Relating to the creation of an advisory committee to the
- 2 fish and wildlife commission composed of disabled individuals; and
- 3 adding a new section to chapter 77.04 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 77.04 RCW 6 to read as follows:
- 7 (1) The commission must appoint an advisory committee to generally
- 8 represent the interests of disabled hunters and fishers on matters
- 9 including, but not limited to, special hunts, modified sporting
- 10 equipment, access to public land, and hunting and fishing
- 11 opportunities. The advisory committee is composed of seven members,
- 12 each being a person with a disability. The advisory committee members
- 13 must represent the entire state. The members must be appointed so that
- 14 each of the six department administrative regions are represented with
- 15 one resident on the advisory committee. One additional member must be
- 16 appointed at large. The chair of the advisory committee must be a
- 17 member of the advisory committee and shall be selected by the members
- 18 of the advisory committee.

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- 1 (2) For the purposes of this section, a person with a disability 2 includes but is not limited to:
- 3 (a) A permanently disabled person who is not ambulatory over 4 natural terrain without a prosthesis or assistive device;
- 5 (b) A permanently disabled person who is unable to walk without the 6 use of assistance from a brace, cane, crutch, wheelchair, scooter, 7 walker, or other assistive device;
- 8 (c) A person who has a cardiac condition to the extent that the 9 person's functional limitations are severe;
- 10 (d) A person who is restricted by lung disease to the extent that 11 the person's functional limitations are severe;
  - (e) A person who is totally blind or visually impaired; or

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- (f) A permanently disabled person with upper or lower extremity impairments who does not have the use of one or both upper or lower extremities.
- 16 (3) The members of the advisory committee are appointed for a four-17 year term. If a vacancy occurs on the advisory committee prior to the 18 expiration of a term, the commission must appoint a replacement within 19 sixty days to complete the term.
- 20 (4) The advisory committee must meet at least semi-annually, and
  21 may meet at other times as requested by a majority of the advisory
  22 committee members for any express purpose that directly relates to the
  23 duties set forth in subsection (1) of this section. A majority of
  24 members currently serving on the advisory committee constitutes a
  25 quorum. The department must provide two staff support persons for all
  26 official advisory committee meetings.
- (5) Each member of the advisory committee shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for travel expenses as authorized in RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.
- 30 (6) The members of the advisory committee, or individuals acting on 31 their behalf, are immune from civil liability for official acts 32 performed in the course of their duties.
- (7) The provisions of this section constitute a pilot program that expires July 1, 2005. On December 1, 2004, the commission shall present a report to the appropriate legislative committees detailing the effectiveness of the advisory committee, including but not limited to, the participation levels, general interest, quality of advice, and

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- 1 recommendations as to the advisory committee's continuance or
- 2 modification.

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
