- 1 AN ACT Relating to the treatment of laying hens; adding a new
- 2 chapter to Title 16 RCW; prescribing penalties; and providing an
- 3 effective date.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that:
- 6 (1) Commercial egg production is a source of food and laying hens
- 7 must be kept in conditions that promote public health;
- 8 (2) The confinement of laying hens in battery cages is
- 9 unnecessarily cruel and promotes the production of contaminated eggs;
- 10 (3) The deliberate withholding of food and water to laying hens for
- 11 the purpose of increasing or extending egg production is unnecessarily
- 12 cruel; and
- 13 (4) Chickens are sentient creatures such that we have an obligation
- 14 to ensure that they are not confined or treated in a manner that
- 15 produces unnecessary suffering.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The definitions in this section apply
- 17 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

- 1 (1) "Battery cage" means a cage used for the confinement of laying
- 2 hens.
- 3 (2) "Debeaking" means to remove the beak, or portion thereof, of
- 4 the laying hen.
- 5 (3) "Forced molting" means the deliberate withholding of food or
- 6 water to a laying hen for the purpose of increasing or extending egg
- 7 production.
- 8 (4) "Laying hen" means a live female chicken kept for commercial
- 9 egg production.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** (1) A person may not confine laying hens in
- 11 battery cages.
- 12 (2) A person may not subject a laying hen to forced molting.
- 13 (3) A person may not remove the beak, or any portion thereof, of a
- 14 laying hen.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 4.** A person may not confine a laying hen
- 16 without providing the laying hen, on a daily basis, access to natural
- 17 light and the opportunity to engage in natural behaviors including, but
- 18 not limited to, walking, perching, dirt scratching, stretching wings,
- 19 and dust bathing.
- 20 <u>NEW SECTION</u>. **Sec. 5.** A person who knowingly violates section 3
- 21 (1), (2), or (3) of this act is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 6.** (1) Any person or entity who believes that
- 23 any person or entity has or is violating this chapter may seek
- 24 injunctive relief to prevent any continued violation.
- 25 (2) The prevailing party in an action for injunctive relief under
- 26 this section is entitled to recover reasonable costs and reasonable
- 27 attorneys' fees.
- 28 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7.** This chapter applies to commercial egg
- 29 production and operations that are required to be licensed under
- 30 chapter 69.25 RCW.
- 31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 8.** Sections 1 through 7 of this act constitute
- 32 a new chapter in Title 16 RCW.
