1 AN ACT Relating to third-party administrators for health carriers; 2 creating a new section; and declaring an emergency.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The insurance commissioner shall 5 establish the task force on third-party administrator regulation. The task force shall consist of thirteen members. The co-speakers of the 6 7 house of representatives shall select two members from the house of representatives, one from each political caucus, and the president of 8 the senate shall select two members from the senate, one from each 9 10 political caucus. The commissioner shall select two members representing health carriers, one member representing third-party 11 administrators with a contractual relationship with a health carrier, 12 13 one member representing health care purchasers, two members 14 representing licensed health care providers, two members representing 15 consumers, and one representative of the office of insurance 16 commissioner, who shall act in an ex officio capacity.

17 (2) The task force shall review the need for regulation of third-18 party administrators, including:

19 (a) Network adequacy and disclosure of network adequacy standards;

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(b) Provider application and credentialing processes;

2 (c) The consistency of third-party administrator standards and
3 benefit packages sold by health carriers, including utilization
4 guidelines;

5 (d) The revocation of prior authorization;

6 (e) The receipt of provider claims; and

7 (f) The classes of third-party administrators that should be 8 subject to state regulation.

9 (3) The task force shall report its findings and recommendations to the legislature no later than December 15, 2001. In conducting its 10 work, the task force shall monitor the development of the national 11 association of insurance commissioners proposal to develop a model 12 state statute on the regulation of third-party administrators, and 13 incorporate appropriate elements of the model statute 14 in its 15 recommendation to the legislature.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate 17 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the 18 state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect 19 immediately.

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
