- 1 AN ACT Relating to requiring antismoking instruction in grades six
- 2 through twelve; adding a new section to chapter 28A.230 RCW; and
- 3 creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that:
- 6 (1) Every day three thousand children become smokers, and one out
- 7 of three will die from nicotine-related causes.
- 8 (2) Two out of three children from twelve to seventeen years of age
- 9 who smoke show signs of addiction.
- 10 (3) Nearly one in five deaths in the United States are a result of
- 11 tobacco use.
- 12 (4) The average age of first tobacco use is eleven to fifteen
- 13 years.
- 14 (5) Over three million adolescents currently smoke.
- 15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.230
- 16 RCW to read as follows:

p. 1 HB 1932

- 1 All students in grades six through twelve shall receive no less
- 2 than fifty minutes of antismoking instruction on or before November 1st
- 3 of each year.
