1 AN ACT Relating to conditional scholarships; and adding a new 2 section to chapter 28B.80 RCW.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 28B.80 RCW 5 to read as follows:

б (1) The higher education coordinating board shall offer conditional 7 scholarships for full or part-time studies that may be forgiven in exchange for teaching service in Washington's public K-12 schools. 8 Applicants must have a declared intention to complete an approved 9 10 preparation program leading to teacher certification with an endorsement in math, science, technology, or bilingual education or be 11 12 a teacher who is seeking an additional endorsement in math, science, 13 technology, or bilingual education. Students are eligible to receive 14 a conditional scholarship not to exceed four thousand dollars for the 15 2001-02 academic year. The higher education coordinating board may increase the maximum value of the award in proportion to the increase 16 17 of tuition and fees for a resident undergraduate student at the University of Washington. Students are eligible to receive conditional 18 19 scholarships for a maximum of five years.

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(2) When selecting scholarship recipients, the higher education 1 coordinating board shall give priority to students who are bilingual 2 and who are able to demonstrate their dual language proficiency by 3 4 meeting a standard established by the board. The board shall establish the standard in consultation with the office of the superintendent of 5 public instruction's bilingual education advisory committee. The board 6 may also consider the applicant's demonstrated academic ability and 7 8 commitment to serve as a teacher within the state of Washington.

9 (3) Loans shall be forgiven at the rate of one year of loan for two 10 years of teaching service. Recipients who teach in geographic or 11 subject-matter shortage areas, as specified by the office of the 12 superintendent of public instruction, may have their loans forgiven at 13 the rate of one year of loan for one year of teaching service.

(4) Recipients who fail to fulfill the required teaching service shall be required to repay the conditional loan with interest. The higher education coordinating board shall define the terms for repayment, including applicable interest rates, fees, and deferments, and may adopt other rules as necessary to implement this program.

(5) Appropriations, private donations, or any other funds given to the higher education coordinating board for this program, and all collections will be deposited into the student loan account authorized in RCW 28B.102.060.

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
