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The appropriations in this section are subject to the following conditions and limitations and specified amounts are provided solely for that activity: The Washington traffic safety commission may oversee no more than four pilot projects implementing the use of school zones, railroad traffic safety cameras at construction zones or stoplights, and no more than one pilot project regarding the use of traffic safety cameras in residential neighborhoods, at school zones, railroad crossings, construction zones, or stoplights.

- (1) In order to ensure adequate time in the 2001-03 biennium to evaluate the effectiveness of the pilot program, any programs authorized by the commission must be authorized by December 31, 2001.
- (2) If the state, a county, or a city has established an authorized traffic safety camera pilot program under this section, compensation paid to the manufacturer or vendor of the equipment used: Must be based upon the value of the equipment and services provided or rendered in support of the system; and may not be based upon a portion of the fine or civil penalty imposed or the revenue generated by the equipment.

The study shall determine, at a minimum, the various types of fire-fighting apparatus currently in use on state roadways; the size, weight and load effect of fire-fighting apparatus that are currently in use or that potentially could be in use on the state roadways, as well as on state bridges; and the effect on public safety. The study may examine state and federal laws that affect fire-fighting apparatuses. House of representatives transportation committee cochairs shall each appoint one member from their respective caucus to serve as cochair of the study group. The study shall be staffed by house of representatives transportation committee staff. The study group will report back to the house of representatives transportation committee by January 1, 2002.
 - (5) The legislative transportation committee shall conduct a feasibility study of potential for economic partnerships between the Washington state ferries and local government entities, including but not limited to port districts. The study is intended to improve ferry terminals. The study shall, at a minimum, identify the market,

The legislative oversight committee 6 shall analyze and make recommendations on: (a) The barriers that 7 prevent the private sector from providing transportation services, 8 which could include ferry, bus, or monorail; (b) the use of public-9 private partnerships nationally and the experiences of other states in 10 using public-private partnerships; (c) the public-private opportunities 11 12 for transportation projects in Washington; and (d) the advantages and disadvantages of the financing options available for public-private 13 14 partnerships. The legislative oversight committee shall report its findings and recommendations to the legislature by December 1, 2003. 15 (10) The legislative transportation committee shall form a working 16 group to evaluate the feasibility of developing an alternative corridor 17 18 to Interstate 5 and Interstate 405 to expedite the movement of commerce 19 between the Canadian border, the central Puget Sound region, the south Puget Sound region, and more southerly areas. The corridor would run 20 from approximately the Canadian border in the north to approximately 21 Lewis county in the south. This alternative corridor analysis shall 22 address truck, rail, pipeline, and other utility needs for the 23 24 corridor, to determine the feasibility of financing and constructing such a corridor, taking into consideration: (a) Anticipated present 25 and future freight demand as well as freight traffic relief for 26 existing state highway and rail routes; (b) the potential for carrying 27 general purpose traffic to provide relief for other state highway 28 29 routes; (c) a cost-benefit analysis detailing various funding 30 possibilities, including federal funds and the use of charges and tolls to fund construction and operation of the corridor as a utility 31 corridor and a toll facility; (d) an analysis detailing possible right 32 of way locations, including but not limited to property donations, 33 34 trades, or credits between or among the public and private sector; and (e) possible private sector, local, or other partnerships that may be 35 36 used to fund the project.

The working group shall report its findings to the full committee by December 15, 2002.
