- 1 AN ACT Relating to establishing the orca whale as the state mammal;
- 2 adding a new section to chapter 1.20 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that many people visit
- 5 Washington state to watch orca whales, the orca whale is a significant
- 6 symbol for the Native American culture, there are pods of orca whales
- 7 that migrate annually through Puget Sound, and the orca whale is easily
- 8 recognizable because of its distinct markings. The legislature intends
- 9 to promote orca whale awareness and to encourage protection of the
- 10 natural marine habitat by designating the orca whale as the official
- 11 mammal of the state of Washington.
- 12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 1.20 RCW
- 13 to read as follows:
- 14 The orca whale, orcinus orca, is hereby designated as the official
- 15 mammal of the state of Washington.
