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## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 4422

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State of Washington 57th Legislature 2002 Regular Session

Read first time 01/17/2002. Referred to Committee on Health Care.

- 1 WHEREAS, An adequate supply of health care personnel is of critical
- 2 importance to the well-being of Washington residents; and
- WHEREAS, Washington state is facing a growing public health crisis
- 4 because of a shortage of health care personnel; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The shortage of health care personnel threatens the
- 6 ability of Washington residents to continue to obtain quality,
- 7 accessible health care;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the House of Representatives,
- 9 the Senate concurring, That a Health Care Work Force Commission is
- 10 established. The commission shall consist of no more than seventeen
- 11 members appointed in the following manner:
- 12 (1) Two members from the House of Representatives, one from the
- 13 majority party and one from the minority party, to be appointed by the
- 14 Speaker of the House;
- 15 (2) Two members from the Senate, one from the majority party and
- 16 one from the minority party, to be appointed by the President of the
- 17 Senate;
- 18 (3) One member shall represent hospitals, to be appointed by the
- 19 Governor;
- 20 (4) One member shall represent public hospital districts, to be
- 21 appointed by the Governor;

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- 1 (5) One member shall represent nurses, to be appointed by the 2 Governor;
- 3 (6) One member shall represent physicians, to be appointed by the 4 Governor;
- 5 (7) One member shall represent allied health professionals, to be 6 appointed by the Governor;
- 7 (8) One member shall represent long-term care providers, to be 8 appointed by the Governor;
- 9 (9) One member shall represent the Washington State Department of 10 Health;
- 11 (10) One member shall represent the Work Force Training and 12 Education Coordinating Board;
- 13 (11) One member shall represent the Higher Education Coordinating 14 Board;
- 15 (12) One member shall represent the State Board for Community and 16 Technical Colleges;
- 17 (13) One member shall represent the Office of Superintendent of 18 Public Instruction;
- 19 (14) One member shall represent organized labor, to be appointed by 20 the Governor; and
- (15) The Governor shall appoint a chairperson of the commission who has no connection to the health care industry and who shall represent the public at large; and
- 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That consistent with funds appropriated 25 specifically for this purpose, the commission may hire staff, appoint 26 technical advisory committees, and contract for professional 27 State agencies, the Senate, and the House assistance. Representatives may provide staff support upon request of the 28 commission. The commission also has authority to seek and expend funds 29 30 from private foundations; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That in the conduct of its business, the commission shall have reasonable access to health care personnel and related work force data available to all state agencies. All state agencies shall provide the commission with all requested health personnel data and other relevant work force information maintained by their agencies in a timely manner; and
- 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That members of the commission shall 38 receive no compensation for their service, except that travel expenses 39 shall be reimbursed from whatever funds are made available to the

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- 1 commission, pursuant to RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060, and for members of
- 2 the Legislature appointed to the commission, travel expenses shall be
- 3 reimbursed pursuant to RCW 44.04.120; and
- 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the commission shall develop a
- 5 Washington state strategic plan for ensuring an adequate supply of
- 6 health personnel and safeguarding the ability of the health care
- 7 delivery system in Washington state to provide quality, accessible
- 8 health care to residents of Washington, which shall:
- 9 (1) Identify ways to increase the capacity of health professions'
- 10 training programs to prepare students to meet the increasing need for
- 11 health care workers;
- 12 (2) Identify ways to improve the marketing and outreach of the
- 13 health professions and improve recruitment of and support for students
- 14 interested in them;
- 15 (3) Recommend changes to streamline entry to practice regulations
- 16 and requirements. The commission shall not entertain discussions on
- 17 changes to existing scopes of practice;
- 18 (4) Recommend changes to federal and state statutes and regulations
- 19 that prevent stimulating and rewarding practice environments;
- 20 (5) Recommend ways to increase the diversity of health professions,
- 21 engage families transitioning from welfare to work, and encourage other
- 22 currently unemployed workers to seek jobs in the health care
- 23 industries; and
- 24 (6) Identify existing funding mechanisms that may be used to
- 25 implement the commission's recommendations; and
- 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the commission shall submit an interim
- 27 report to the Governor and the Legislature on or before December 31,
- 28 2002, and a final report to include a state strategic plan by December
- 29 31, 2003. The commission shall cease to exist on December 31, 2003.

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
