1 TO THE HONORABLE GEORGE W. BUSH, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, 2 AND TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF 3 REPRESENTATIVES, AND TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 4 UNITED STATES, IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, AND TO THE SECRETARY OF ENERGY: 5 We, your Memorialists, the Senate and House of Representatives of 6 the State of Washington, in legislative session assembled, respectfully 7 represent and petition as follows:

8 WHEREAS, The Fast Flux Test Facility is the nation's most advanced 9 test reactor; and

10 WHEREAS, Numerous independent studies have suggested that the 11 facility could one day be used to produce cancer-curing medical 12 isotopes; and

WHEREAS, The facility has also been considered by the Department of Energy for short-term production of tritium for our nation's defense needs; and

16 WHEREAS, Utilizing the Fast Flux Test Facility for this purpose 17 could help postpone construction of more expensive options for tritium 18 production, thus freeing federal dollars for environmental purposes 19 during the Department of Energy's "Ten-Year Cleanup Plan"; and

WHEREAS, This would protect Hanford cleanup from budget pressures
 during this time frame and ensure that the federal government fulfills
 its responsibilities under the Tri-Party Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Private sector involvement in the Fast Flux Test Facility
project could further reduce federal expenditures needed for tritium
production; and

7 WHEREAS, The use of the Fast Flux Test Facility for the production
8 of cancer-curing medical isotopes could lead to the development of a
9 major cancer treatment center in Washington State; and

10 WHEREAS, Sixty-nine nationally recognized cancer researchers have 11 expressed their strong support for preserving the Fast Flux Test 12 Facility, and have argued that they would find it "unconscionable to 13 shut down the Fast Flux Test Facility without a full review of its 14 potential for future operation, including isotope production"; and

15 WHEREAS, The Department of Energy is proceeding to deactivate the 16 Fast Flux Test Facility despite overwhelming evidence supporting a 17 decision to develop the facility for medical and tritium production 18 purposes;

NOW, THEREFORE, Your Memorialists respectfully pray that the United States Congress and executive agencies halt deactivation of the Fast Flux Test Facility and begin developing the facility for medical and tritium production purposes.

BE IT RESOLVED, That copies of this Memorial be immediately transmitted to the Honorable George W. Bush, President of the United States, the Secretary of Energy, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and each member of Congress from the State of Washington.
