- (i))) (d) Products for lower value uses containing recycled 1 2 plastics; 3 (((ii))) (e) Retread and remanufactured tires; 4 (((iii))) <u>(f)</u> Lubricating oils; 5 (((iv))) (g) Automotive batteries; (((v))) (h) Building ((insulation)) products and materials; 6 7 $((\frac{(vi)}{)}))$ (i) Panelboard; and 8 (((vii))) <u>(j)</u> Compost products. 9 (2) By July 1, 2001, the director shall adopt product standards for strawboard manufactured using as an ingredient straw that is 10 produced as a by-product in the production of cereal grain or turf 11 or grass seed and product standards for products made from 12 13 strawboard. (3) The standards required by this section shall be applied to 14 15 recycled product purchasing by the department ((and)), other state agencies, and state postsecondary educational institutions. 16 17 standards may be adopted or applied by any other local government in product procurement. The standards shall provide for exceptions 18 19 under appropriate circumstances to allow purchases of recycled 20 products that do not meet the minimum content requirements of the standards. 21 22 NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate
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preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of

the state government and its existing public institutions, and

takes effect July 1, 2001.

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
