- 1 AN ACT Relating to educational service districts' authority to
- 2 borrow; and amending RCW 28A.310.200.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 28A.310.200 and 1993 c 298 s 1 are each amended to 5 read as follows:
- In addition to other powers and duties as provided by law, very educational service district board shall:
- 8 (1) Approve the budgets of the educational service district in 9 accordance with the procedures provided for in this chapter.
- 10 (2) Meet regularly according to the schedule adopted at the 11 organization meeting and in special session upon the call of the 12 chair or a majority of the board.
- 13 (3) Approve the selection of educational service district 14 personnel and clerical staff as provided in RCW 28A.310.230.
- 15 (4) Fix the amount of and approve the bonds for those
- 16 educational service district employees designated by the board as
- 17 being in need of bonding.

- 1 (5) Keep in the educational service district office a full and 2 correct transcript of the boundaries of each school district 3 within the educational service district.
- 4 (6) Acquire by borrowing funds or by purchase, lease, devise, beguest, and gift and otherwise contract for real and personal 5 property necessary for the operation of the educational service 6 district and to the execution of the duties of the board and 7 8 superintendent thereof and sell, lease, or otherwise dispose of 9 that property not necessary for district purposes. No real property 10 shall be acquired or alienated without the prior approval of the state board of education and the acquisition or alienation of all 11 such property shall be subject to such provisions as the board may 12 establish. When borrowing funds for the purpose of acquiring 13 property, the educational service district board shall pledge as 14 15 collateral the property to be acquired. Borrowing shall be evidenced by a note or other instrument between the district and 16 the lender. ((The authority to borrow under this subsection shall 17 be limited to educational service districts serving a minimum of 18 19 two hundred thousand students in grades kindergarten through 20 twelve.))
- (7) Under RCW 28A.310.010, upon the written request of the 21 board of directors of a local school district or districts served 22 by the educational service district, the educational service 23 24 district board of directors may provide cooperative and 25 informational services not in conflict with other law that provide 26 for the development and implementation of programs, activities, 27 services, or practices that support the education of preschool through twelfth grade students in the public schools or that 28 29 support the effective, efficient, or safe management and operation 30 of the school district or districts served by the educational 31 service district.
- 32 (8) Adopt such bylaws and rules and regulations for its own 33 operation as it deems necessary or appropriate.
- (9) Enter into contracts, including contracts with common and educational service districts and the school for the deaf and the school for the blind for the joint financing of cooperative service programs conducted pursuant to RCW 28A.310.180(3), and
