1 AN ACT Relating to limited public works; and amending RCW 2 39.04.155.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 39.04.155 and 2000 c 138 s 101 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 (1) This section provides uniform small works roster provisions 7 to award contracts for construction, building, renovation, remodeling, alteration, repair, or improvement of real property 8 9 that may be used by state agencies and by any local government 10 that is expressly authorized to use these provisions. These provisions may be used in lieu of other procedures to award 11 contracts for such work with an estimated cost of two hundred 12 thousand dollars or less. The small works roster process includes 13 14 the limited public works process authorized under subsection (3) 15 of this section and any local government authorized to award contracts using the small works roster process under this section 16 17 may award contracts using the limited public works process under subsection (3) of this section. 18

(2)(a) A state agency or authorized local government may create 1 a single general small works roster, or may create a small works 2 3 roster for different specialties or categories of anticipated 4 work. Where applicable, small works rosters may make distinctions between contractors based upon different geographic areas served 5 by the contractor. The small works roster or rosters shall consist 6 7 of all responsible contractors who have requested to be on the 8 list, and where required by law are properly licensed or 9 registered to perform such work in this state. A state agency or 10 local government establishing a small works roster or rosters may require eligible contractors desiring to be placed on a roster or 11 rosters to keep current records of any applicable licenses, 12 certifications, registrations, bonding, insurance, or other 13 14 appropriate matters on file with the state agency or local 15 government as a condition of being placed on a roster or rosters. 16 At least once a year, the state agency or local government shall 17 publish in a newspaper of general circulation within the jurisdiction a notice of the existence of the roster or rosters 18 19 and solicit the names of contractors for such roster or rosters. In addition, responsible contractors shall be added to an 20 appropriate roster or rosters at any time they submit a written 21 22 request and necessary records. Master contracts may be required to be signed that become effective when a specific award is made 23 24 using a small works roster.

25 ((((3))) (b) A state agency establishing a small works roster or 26 rosters shall adopt rules implementing this ((section)) subsection. A local government establishing a small works roster or 27 rosters shall adopt an ordinance or resolution implementing this 28 29 ((section)) subsection. Procedures included in rules adopted by the 30 department of general administration in implementing this 31 ((section)) subsection must be included in any rules providing for a small works roster or rosters that is adopted by another state 32 agency, if the authority for that state agency to engage in these 33 34 activities has been delegated to it by the department of general 35 administration under chapter 43.19 RCW. An interlocal contract or agreement between two or more state agencies or local governments 36 37 establishing a small works roster or rosters to be used by the

1 parties to the agreement or contract must clearly identify the 2 lead entity that is responsible for implementing the provisions of 3 this ((section)) subsection.

4 (((4))) (c) Procedures shall be established for securing 5 telephone, written, or electronic quotations from contractors on б the appropriate small works roster to assure that a competitive price is established and to award contracts to the lowest 7 8 responsible bidder, as defined in RCW 43.19.1911. Invitations for 9 quotations shall include an estimate of the scope and nature of 10 the work to be performed as well as materials and equipment to be furnished. However, detailed plans and specifications need not be 11 included in the invitation. This ((section)) subsection does not 12 eliminate other requirements for architectural or engineering 13 14 approvals as to quality and compliance with building 15 codes. Quotations may be invited from all appropriate contractors on the appropriate small works roster. As an alternative, 16 quotations may be invited from at least five contractors on the 17 18 appropriate small works roster who have indicated the capability 19 of performing the kind of work being contracted, in a manner that 20 will equitably distribute the opportunity among the contractors on the appropriate roster. However, if the estimated cost of the work 21 22 is from one hundred thousand dollars to two hundred thousand dollars, a state agency or local government, other than a port 23 24 district, that chooses to solicit bids from less than all the 25 appropriate contractors on the appropriate small works roster must 26 also notify the remaining contractors on the appropriate small works roster that quotations on the work are being sought. 27 The government has the sole option of determining whether this notice 28 29 to the remaining contractors is made by: (((a))) <u>(i)</u> Publishing 30 notice in a legal newspaper in general circulation in the area where the work is to be done; (((b))) (ii) mailing a notice to 31 these contractors; or (((c))) <u>(iii)</u> sending a notice to these 32 contractors by facsimile or other electronic means. For purposes of 33 34 this subsection (2)(c), "equitably distribute" means that a state agency or local government soliciting bids may not favor certain 35 contractors on the appropriate small works roster over other 36 37 contractors on the appropriate small works roster who perform similar services. 38

1 (((5))) <u>(d)</u> A contract awarded from a small works roster under 2 this section need not be advertised.

3 ((((6)))) <u>(e)</u> Immediately after an award is made, the bid 4 quotations obtained shall be recorded, open to public inspection, 5 and available by telephone inquiry.

б (((7))) (3) In lieu of awarding contracts under subsection (2) 7 of this section, a state agency or authorized local government may award a contract for work, construction, alteration, repair, or 8 9 improvement project estimated to cost less than thirty-five 10 thousand dollars using the limited public works process provided under this subsection. Public works projects awarded under this 11 subsection are exempt from the other requirements of the small 12 13 works roster process provided under subsection (2) of this section 14 and are exempt from the requirement that contracts be awarded 15 after advertisement as provided under RCW 39.04.010.

For limited public works projects, a state agency or authorized 16 local government shall solicit electronic or written guotations 17 from a minimum of three contractors including a certified minority 18 19 or certified woman-owned contractor, when practicable and to the extent permitted by the Washington state civil rights act, RCW 20 49.60.400, and shall award the contract to the lowest responsible 21 bidder as defined under RCW 43.19.1911, even if only one quotation 22 is received, or reject all quotations. After an award is made, the 23 24 quotations shall be open to public inspection and available by 25 electronic request. A state agency or authorized local government 26 shall attempt to distribute opportunities for limited public works projects equitably among contractors willing to perform in the 27 geographic area of the work. A state agency or authorized local 28 29 government shall maintain a list each biennium of the contracts 30 awarded under the limited public works process, including the name 31 of the contractor, the amount of the contract, a brief description of the type of work performed, and the date the contract was 32 awarded. For limited public works projects, a state agency or 33 34 authorized local government may waive the payment and performance 35 bond requirements of chapter 39.08 RCW and the retainage requirements of chapter 60.28 RCW, thereby assuming the liability 36 37 for the contractor's nonpayment of laborers, mechanics, subcontractors, materialmen, suppliers, and taxes imposed under 38

1 <u>Title 82 RCW that may be due from the contractor for the limited</u> 2 <u>public works project, however the state agency or authorized local</u> 3 <u>government shall have the right of recovery against the contractor</u> 4 for any payments made on the contractor's behalf.

5 <u>(4)</u> The breaking of any project into units or accomplishing any 6 projects by phases is prohibited if it is done for the purpose of 7 avoiding the maximum dollar amount of a contract that may be let 8 using the small works roster process <u>or limited public works</u> 9 <u>process</u>.

10 (((8))) <u>(5)</u> As used in this section, "state agency" means the department of general administration, the state parks and 11 recreation commission, the department of natural resources, the 12 13 department of fish and wildlife, the department of transportation, any institution of higher education as defined under RCW 14 15 28B.10.016, and any other state agency delegated authority by the 16 department of general administration to engage in construction, 17 building, renovation, remodeling, alteration, improvement, or repair activities. 18

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
