- 1 AN ACT Relating to adding a victim notification system to the
- 2 state jail booking and reporting system; amending RCW 36.28A.040;
- 3 and adding a new section to chapter 36.28A RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 36.28A
- 6 RCW to read as follows:
- 7 (1) The Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs
- 8 shall integrate a victim notification system into its electronic
- 9 statewide city and county jail booking and reporting system
- 10 described in RCW 36.28A.040.
- 11 (2) At a minimum, the victim notification system shall provide
- 12 to victims of crime who have made a notification request,
- 13 notification of information received by the statewide city and
- 14 county jail booking and reporting system about the release or
- 15 transfer of an incarcerated person from a local jail, juvenile
- 16 detention facility, or release from a partial confinement program
- 17 operated by a city or county.

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Sec. 2. RCW 36.28A.040 and 2000 c 3 s 1 are each amended to read as follows:

- 3 (1) No later than ((December 31, 2001)) July 1, 2002, the 4 Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs shall implement and operate an electronic statewide city and county jail 5 booking and reporting system. The system shall serve as a central 6 7 repository and instant information source for offender information 8 and jail statistical data. The system shall be placed on the 9 Washington state justice information network and be capable of 10 communicating electronically with every Washington state city and 11 county jail and with all other Washington state criminal justice 12 agencies as defined in RCW 10.97.030.
- (2) After the Washington association of sheriffs and police 13 14 chiefs has implemented an electronic jail booking system as 15 described in subsection (1) of this section, if a city or county 16 jail or law enforcement agency receives state or federal funding to cover the entire cost of implementing or reconfiguring an 17 18 electronic jail booking system, the city or county jail or law 19 enforcement agency shall implement or reconfigure an electronic 20 jail booking system that is in compliance with the jail booking 21 system standards developed pursuant to subsection (4) of this 22 section.
- 23 (3) After the Washington association of sheriffs and police 24 chiefs has implemented an electronic jail booking system as 25 described in subsection (1) of this section, city or county jails, or law enforcement agencies that operate electronic jail booking 26 systems, but choose not to accept state or federal money to 27 implement or reconfigure electronic jail booking systems, shall 28 29 electronically forward jail booking information to the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs. At a minimum the 30 information forwarded shall include the name of the offender, 31 32 vital statistics, the date the offender was arrested, the offenses 33 arrested for, the date and time an offender is released or 34 transferred from a city or county jail, a city or county juvenile detention facility, or a partial confinement program that is 35 36 operated by a city or county, and if available, the mug shot. electronic format in which the information is sent shall be at the 37

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- 1 discretion of the city or county jail, or law enforcement agency
- 2 forwarding the information. City and county jails or law
- 3 enforcement agencies that forward jail booking information under
- 4 this subsection are not required to comply with the standards
- 5 developed under subsection (4)(b) of this section.
- 6 (4) The Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs
- 7 shall appoint, convene, and manage a statewide jail booking and
- 8 reporting system standards committee. The committee shall include
- 9 representatives from the Washington association of sheriffs and
- 10 police chiefs correction committee, the information service
- 11 board's justice information committee, the judicial information
- 12 system, at least two individuals who serve as jailers in a city or
- 13 county jail, and other individuals that the Washington association
- 14 of sheriffs and police chiefs places on the committee. The
- 15 committee shall have the authority to:
- 16 (a) Develop and amend as needed standards for the statewide
- 17 jail booking and reporting system and for the information that
- 18 must be contained within the system. At a minimum, the system shall
- 19 contain:
- 20 (i) The offenses the individual has been charged with;
- 21 (ii) Descriptive and personal information about each offender
- 22 booked into a city or county jail. At a minimum, this information
- 23 shall contain the offender's name, vital statistics, address, and
- 24 mugshot;
- 25 (iii) Information about the offender while in jail, which could
- 26 be used to protect criminal justice officials that have future
- 27 contact with the offender, such as medical conditions, acts of
- 28 violence, and other behavior problems;
- 29 (iv) Statistical data indicating the current capacity of each
- 30 jail and the quantity and category of offenses charged; ((and))
- 31 (v) The ability to communicate directly and immediately with
- 32 the city and county jails and other criminal justice entities; and
- 33 (vi) The date and time that an offender was released or
- 34 transferred from a local jail, juvenile detention facility, or
- 35 released from a partial confinement program operated by a city or
- 36 <u>county;</u>
- 37 (b) Develop and amend as needed operational standards for city
- 38 and county jail booking systems, which at a minimum shall include

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- 1 the type of information collected and transmitted, and the
- 2 technical requirements needed for the city and county jail booking
- 3 system to communicate with the statewide jail booking and
- 4 reporting system;
- 5 (c) Develop and amend as needed standards for allocating grants 6 to city and county jails or law enforcement agencies that will be
- 7 implementing or reconfiguring electronic jail booking systems.
- 8 (5) By January 1, 2001, the standards committee shall complete
- 9 the initial standards described in subsection (4) of this section,
- 10 and the standards shall be placed into a report and provided to
- 11 all Washington state city and county jails, all other criminal
- 12 justice agencies as defined in RCW 10.97.030, the chair of the
- 13 Washington state senate human services and corrections committee,
- 14 and the chair of the Washington state house of representatives
- 15 criminal justice and corrections committee.

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
