- 1 AN ACT Relating to the denial of unemployment insurance benefits
- 2 due to criminal acts of the employee; and amending RCW 50.04.293 and
- 3 50.20.060.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 **Sec. 1.** RCW 50.04.293 and 1993 c 483 s 1 are each amended to read 6 as follows:
- 7 "Misconduct" means an employee's act or failure to act in willful
- 8 disregard of his or her employer's interest where the effect of the
- 9 employee's act or failure to act is to harm the employer's business.
- 10 Any criminal act conducted by the employee at or involving the
- 11 employer's business is an act in willful disregard of the employer's
- 12 interest.
- 13 **Sec. 2.** RCW 50.20.060 and 2000 c 2 s 13 are each amended to read
- 14 as follows:
- 15 An individual shall be disqualified from benefits beginning with
- 16 the first day of the calendar week in which he or she has been
- 17 discharged or suspended for misconduct connected with his or her work
- 18 and thereafter for seven calendar weeks and until he or she has

obtained bona fide work in employment covered by this title and earned 1 wages in that employment equal to seven times his or her weekly benefit 2 3 amount. However, when the employer has a reasonable, good faith belief 4 that the individual's misconduct constituted a criminal act at or involving the employer's business, the individual may not requalify for 5 benefits under this section for one calendar year from the first day of 6 the calendar week in which he or she has been discharged or suspended 7 8 for misconduct connected with his or her work. Alcoholism shall not 9 constitute a defense to disqualification from benefits due to 10 misconduct.
