1 AN ACT Relating to transportation funding and appropriations; 2 creating new sections; making appropriations and authorizing 3 expenditures for capital improvements; and declaring an emergency.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The transportation budget of the state б is hereby adopted and, subject to the provisions set forth, the several 7 amounts specified, or as much thereof as may be necessary to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby appropriated from the several 8 accounts and funds named to the designated state agencies and offices 9 10 for employee compensation and other expenses, for capital projects, and for other specified purposes, including the payment of any final 11 judgments arising out of such activities, for the period ending June 12 13 30, 2003.

(2) Legislation with fiscal impacts enacted in the 2001 legislative
 session not assumed in this act are not funded in the 2001-03
 transportation budget.

(3) Unless the context clearly requires otherwise, the definitionsin this subsection apply throughout this act.

(a) "Fiscal year 2002" or "FY 2002" means the fiscal year ending
 June 30, 2002.

3 (b) "Fiscal year 2003" or "FY 2003" means the fiscal year ending 4 June 30, 2003.

5 (c) "FTE" means full-time equivalent.

6 (d) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an 7 unappropriated status.

8 (e) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent only9 for the specified purpose.

10 (f) "Performance-based budgeting" means a budget that bases 11 resource needs on quantified outcomes and results expected from use of 12 the total appropriation. "Performance-based budgeting" does not mean 13 incremental budgeting that focuses on justifying changes from the 14 historic budget or to line-item input-driven budgets.

(g) "Goals" means the statements of purpose that identify a desired result or outcome. The statements shall be realistic, achievable, directive, assignable, evaluative, and logically linked to the agency's mission and statutory mandate.

(h) "Strategic plan" means the strategies agencies create for
investment choices in the future. All agency strategic plans shall
present alternative investment strategies for providing services.

PERFORMANCE BASED BUDGETING PROVISIONS

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 501.** Transportation agencies shall continue to 4 refine the following activities in order to establish a performance-5 based budgeting process for the 2003-05 biennial budget:

6 (1) The department of licensing, the department of transportation, 7 and the Washington state patrol, in cooperation with the office of 8 financial management and the senate and house of representatives 9 transportation committees, shall implement a performance budgeting process that provides a measurable link between agency objectives, 10 service levels, and budget proposals. The agencies shall also develop 11 12 indicators of performance, stated in terms of expected results, to measure the agencies' progress in achieving the agencies' goals. 13

14 (2) The transportation agencies shall submit a strategic plan with 15 their agency request budgets. The strategic plan must include a six-16 year outlook and define and clarify the agency mission and vision, 17 provide the basis for budget development, and outline the agency's 18 goals and strategies. Furthermore, the strategic plan shall reflect 19 agency priorities which formed the basis of the agencies' budget 20 development.

(3) The transportation agencies shall establish performance indicators that measure activities and associated goals and strategies in the strategic plan. The agencies shall also provide a preferred level of performance over the next six years.

(4) The senate and house of representatives transportation committees, the office of financial management, and the transportation agencies shall establish the means of conducting program authorization reviews of all transportation programs. The reviews shall include:

(a) An agency self-assessment to judge the quality and usefulness of: (i) The agency's long-term strategic program goals; (ii) current organizational structure; (iii) program priorities and objectives; (iv) activities necessary to achieve program priorities and objectives; (v) service level criteria and performance targets of existing programs and activities; (vi) best practices by other states as a possible benchmark of the performance of their programs; and (vii) results or outcome 1 measures as they relate to achievement of benchmarks given different
2 funding levels;

3 (b) A review of the agency self-assessment and a report to the 4 legislature; and

5 (c) A report which recommends whether to retain, eliminate, or modify funding and related statutory references for the agency. 6 The 7 parties conducting the review shall consider: (i) Whether the agency 8 performance measures adequately measure the agency goals; (ii) whether 9 the program performs efficiently and effectively, including comparisons 10 with other jurisdictions, if applicable; (iii) whether there are other cost-effective alternative methods of accomplishing the program's 11 12 mission; and (iv) whether there are any funds saved by the agency's 13 performance.

(5) The transportation agencies shall each designate a program or
 programs to test the effectiveness of performance-based budgeting for
 the 2003-05 budget submittal period.

17 (6) Each agency shall submit a program list to the transportation 18 committees of the house of representatives and senate and the office of 19 financial management at the end of each fiscal year, which describes 20 the functions of the program, the fund sources for the program, and the 21 number of full-time equivalents, in addition to other performance 22 targets of the program and their relationship to the agency strategic 23 plan.

(7) The transportation agencies shall develop agency biennial budget requests at the agency budget program level, rather than the object level, and submit their biennial and supplemental budget requests to the office of financial management via a common budget system beginning July 1, 2003.

(8) The agencies shall input monthly their financial information and quarterly program performance measurements into the transportation executive information system and other systems as required by the office of financial management. The agencies shall report actuals to date against original allotments, in addition to plan to date. Original allotments may reflect supplemental budget changes as changed by the legislature and the governor.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 601. The following bills are necessary to
 implement portions of this act: Senate Bill Nos. 5326 and 5078 and
 House Bill No. 1736.

4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 602. The highways and local programs division of 5 of the Washington state department transportation, the transportation improvement board, the county road administration board, 6 7 the freight mobility strategic investment board, the association of 8 Washington cities, and the Washington state association of counties 9 shall establish and staff a joint task force that will develop recommendations to establish a one-stop funding center for state funded 10 local grant programs. The task force shall report its recommendations 11 12 to the legislature no later than December 1, 2001. The recommendations of the task force shall address the following: 13

14 (1) Develop a memorandum of understanding that governs a 15 multiagency grant council to coordinate state and federal grant 16 efforts;

17 (2) Develop a simplified grant application form that can be used by18 all local grant-seeking agencies;

19 (3) Coordinate calls for local grant applications;

(4) Increase awareness of state-funded local grant programs; and
 (5) Develop a process to forward applications to other appropriate
 state and federal funding programs.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 603. The senate transportation committee 24 shall convene a task force to study the issues regarding abandoned vehicles, title transfers, license plate transfers, buyer and seller 25 and electronic availability of current vehicle owner 26 reports, 27 information. The task force shall include the following members in 28 addition to the department of licensing: The Washington state tow 29 truck association; the Washington state auto dealers; the independent towers of Washington; the Washington state patrol; and representatives 30 of two local law enforcement agencies. 31

The task force shall consider methods by which vehicle ownership changes can occur more expeditiously, including but not limited to the timing and completeness of the seller reporting the sale of a vehicle, methods to encourage buyers to retitle vehicles in a timely manner, and changes in the processing of abandoned vehicle reports to provide more timely access to registered owner information. The task force shall 1 also consider who bears liability for abandoned vehicles as well as the 2 issue of impounding a registered owner's car when someone other than 3 the owner is driving.

4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 604. The joint legislative audit and review committee shall conduct a performance audit to evaluate the advantages 5 and disadvantages of removing the aviation division from the department 6 7 of transportation and creating a Washington state department of 8 aviation. At a minimum the evaluation must include: (1) A survey of 9 aviation division customers to determine whether the current aviation division meets the needs of those customers; (2) a comparison of 10 procedures, regulations, and requirements of the Federal Aviation 11 12 Administration and the Federal Highway Administration to determine if the federal laws governing the aviation division conflict with those 13 14 governing the department of transportation; (3) an analysis of the 15 department of transportation's processes to determine whether the 16 creation of a separate aviation department would result in a cost savings to the state; and (4) a financial analysis to determine if the 17 18 aviation fuel tax, aircraft registration fees, and other revenue from 19 aviation services would enable a separate aviation division to operate without additional state resources. The joint legislative audit and 20 review committee must report its findings to the legislature and the 21 22 office of financial management by December 1, 2001.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 605. The appropriations assumed in sections 217 24 and 220 of this act are based upon the project list within the 25 transportation executive information system, capital projects and 26 facilities reporting system known as 2001-03 Floor Current Law 27 Budget-Living Within Our Means, dated March 23, 2001.
