## ENGROSSED SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5364

- 1 AN ACT Relating to drivers' licenses and identicards; amending
- 2 RCW 26.23.140 and 26.23.150; and adding a new section to chapter
- 3 46.20 RCW.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 46.20
- 6 RCW to read as follows:
- 7 Any contract entered into between the department and a private
- 8 vendor in which the vendor provides services involving drivers'
- 9 licenses or identicards must contain the following language:
- 10 "Drivers' licenses and identicards must not contain: (1) Driver
- 11 social security numbers in either visible or machine readable
- 12 form; or (2) driver fingerprints or thumbprints."
- 13 **Sec. 2.** RCW 26.23.140 and 1998 c 160 s 6 are each amended to read
- 14 as follows:
- 15 The federal personal responsibility and work opportunity
- 16 reconciliation act of 1996, P.L. 104-193, requires states to
- 17 collect social security numbers as part of the application process

- 1 for professional licenses, driver's licenses, occupational
- 2 licenses, and recreational licenses. The legislature finds that if
- 3 social security numbers are accessible to the public, it will be
- 4 relatively easy for someone to use another's social security
- 5 number fraudulently to assume that person's identity and gain
- 6 access to bank accounts, credit services, billing information,
- 7 driving history, and other sources of personal information.
- 8 ((Public Law 104-193 could compound and exacerbate the disturbing
- 9 trend of social security number-related fraud. In order to prevent
- 10 fraud and curtail invasions of privacy, the governor, through the
- 11 department of social and health services, shall seek a waiver to
- 12 the federal mandate to record social security numbers on
- 13 applications for professional, driver's, occupational, and
- 14 recreational licenses. If a waiver is not granted, the licensing
- 15 agencies shall collect and disclose social security numbers as
- 16 required under RCW 26.23.150.))
- 17 **Sec. 3.** RCW 26.23.150 and 1999 c 138 s 2 are each amended to read
- 18 as follows:
- 19 In order to assist in child support enforcement as required by
- 20 federal law, all applicants for an original, replacement, or
- 21 renewal of a professional license, ((commercial)) driver's
- 22 license, occupational license, or recreational license must
- 23 furnish the licensing agency with the applicant's social security
- 24 number, which shall be recorded on the application. ((No applicant
- 25 for an original, replacement, or renewal noncommercial driver's
- 26 license is required to furnish the licensing agency with the
- 27 applicant's social security number for purposes of assisting in
- 28 child support enforcement prior to the time necessary to comply
- 29 with the federal deadline.)) The licensing agencies collecting
- 30 social security numbers shall not display the social security
- 31 number on the license document. Social security numbers collected
- 32 by licensing agencies shall not be disclosed except as required by
- 33 state or federal law or under RCW 26.23.120. Provided, that the
- 34 governor, through the department of social and health services,
- 35 shall seek a waiver to the federal mandate to record social
- 36 <u>security numbers on applications for professional, driver's,</u>

- 1 occupational, and recreational licenses, and, if such a waiver is
- 2 obtained, then this section shall be null and void.
