## SENATE BILL 5430

State of Washington 57th Legislature 2001 Regular Session

AN ACT Relating to coverage for cranial hair prostheses for alopecia areata; adding a new section to chapter 41.05 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 48.20 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 48.21 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 48.44 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 48.46 RCW; and creating a new section.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. (1) The legislature finds the following:

(a) Alopecia areata and its variants, alopecia totalis and alopecia 8 9 universalis, are common, noncontagious diseases that affect an 10 estimated two million Americans. They are diseases of the hair follicle with results ranging from large patches of baldness to the 11 total loss of all body hair. This hair loss can be acute and short-12 13 lived, occurring in just days or weeks, or chronic with years of 14 regrowth in some sites and progression to new sites.

(b) Alopecia areata and its variants are associated with analteration in the immunological system, but their cause is unknown.

(c) Treatments for alopecia areata, totalis, and universalis using
 immunomodulating agents can stimulate new hair growth, but none prevent
 new patches from developing. These treatments must be continued to

1 maintain their effect, but treatment for alopecia areata may stop when 2 the disease goes into spontaneous remission. There are concerns 3 surrounding the long-term use and side effects of some of the 4 treatments.

5 (d) Children with alopecia areata, totalis, and universalis may 6 suffer a profound alteration in their functional status. Children with 7 alopecia areata, totalis, or universalis have been removed from 8 mainstream classes and placed in special education classes and 9 ostracized by their peers.

10 (e) Alopecia areata, totalis, and universalis are recognized 11 medical disease processes, which cause severe hair loss that can alter 12 a patient's functional status. The use of cranial hair prostheses 13 returns patients to their previous functional status.

14 (2) It is the intent of the legislature to clarify that policies
15 that provide benefits for prostheses must provide benefits for cranial
16 hair prostheses for alopecia areata, totalis, or universalis.

17 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 41.05 RCW
 18 to read as follows:

19 All state-purchased health care that provides coverage for prostheses shall include coverage for cranial hair prostheses for 20 patients under eighteen years of age suffering from alopecia areata, 21 22 totalis, or universalis, to the extent that benefits are provided for 23 alopecia areata, totalis, or universalis, provided that such services 24 are delivered upon the recommendation of the patient's physician or 25 advanced registered nurse practitioner as authorized by the nursing 26 care quality assurance commission pursuant to chapter 18.79 RCW or physician assistant pursuant to chapter 18.71A RCW. 27

This section shall not be construed to prevent the application of standard health plan provisions applicable to other benefits such as deductible or copayment provisions. This section does not limit the authority of the state health care authority to negotiate rates and contract with specific providers for the delivery of prostheses. This section does not apply to medicare supplement policies or supplemental contracts covering a specified disease or other limited benefits.

35 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 48.20 RCW 36 to read as follows:

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An insurer that offers to any individual a health benefit plan that 1 2 provides coverage for prostheses shall include coverage for cranial hair prostheses for patients under eighteen years of age suffering from 3 alopecia areata, totalis, or universalis, to the extent that benefits 4 5 are provided for alopecia areata, totalis, or universalis, provided that such services are delivered upon the recommendation of the 6 patient's physician or advanced registered nurse practitioner as 7 authorized by the nursing care quality assurance commission pursuant to 8 9 chapter 18.79 RCW or physician assistant pursuant to chapter 18.71A 10 RCW.

11 This section shall not be construed to prevent the application of 12 standard health plan provisions applicable to other benefits such as 13 deductible or copayment provisions. This section does not limit the 14 authority of the state health care authority to negotiate rates and 15 contract with specific providers for the delivery of prostheses. This 16 section does not apply to medicare supplement policies or supplemental 17 contracts covering a specified disease or other limited benefits.

18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 48.21 RCW 19 to read as follows:

A group insurance contract or blanket disability insurance contract 20 that provides coverage for prostheses shall include coverage for 21 cranial hair prostheses for patients under eighteen years of age 22 23 suffering from alopecia areata, totalis, or universalis, to the extent 24 that benefits are provided for alopecia areata, totalis, or 25 universalis, provided that such services are delivered upon the recommendation of the patient's physician or advanced registered nurse 26 practitioner as authorized by the nursing care quality assurance 27 commission pursuant to chapter 18.79 RCW or physician assistant 28 29 pursuant to chapter 18.71A RCW.

This section shall not be construed to prevent the application of standard health plan provisions applicable to other benefits such as deductible or copayment provisions. This section does not limit the authority of the state health care authority to negotiate rates and contract with specific providers for the delivery of prostheses. This section does not apply to medicare supplement policies or supplemental contracts covering a specified disease or other limited benefits.

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1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. A new section is added to chapter 48.44 RCW
2 to read as follows:

3 A health service contractor that provides coverage for prostheses 4 shall include coverage for cranial hair prostheses for patients under 5 eighteen years of age suffering from alopecia areata, totalis, or universalis, to the extent that benefits are provided for alopecia 6 7 areata, totalis, or universalis, provided that such services are delivered upon the recommendation of the patient's physician or 8 advanced registered nurse practitioner as authorized by the nursing 9 10 care quality assurance commission pursuant to chapter 18.79 RCW or 11 physician assistant pursuant to chapter 18.71A RCW.

12 This section shall not be construed to prevent the application of 13 standard health plan provisions applicable to other benefits such as 14 deductible or copayment provisions. This section does not limit the 15 authority of the state health care authority to negotiate rates and 16 contract with specific providers for the delivery of prostheses. This 17 section does not apply to medicare supplement policies or supplemental 18 contracts covering a specified disease or other limited benefits.

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. A new section is added to chapter 48.46 RCW 20 to read as follows:

A health maintenance organization that provides coverage for 21 prostheses shall include coverage for cranial hair prostheses for 22 patients under eighteen years of age suffering from alopecia areata, 23 24 totalis, or universalis, to the extent that benefits are provided for 25 alopecia areata, totalis, or universalis, provided that such services are delivered upon the recommendation of the patient's physician or 26 advanced registered nurse practitioner as authorized by the nursing 27 care quality assurance commission pursuant to chapter 18.79 RCW or 28 29 physician assistant pursuant to chapter 18.71A RCW.

This section shall not be construed to prevent the application of standard health plan provisions applicable to other benefits such as deductible or copayment provisions. This section does not limit the authority of the state health care authority to negotiate rates and contract with specific providers for the delivery of prostheses. This section does not apply to medicare supplement policies or supplemental contracts covering a specified disease or other limited benefits.

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
