- 1 AN ACT Relating to lead-based paint activities; and creating new
- 2 sections.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** The legislature finds that public health
- 5 hazards associated with environmental lead exposure represent a
- 6 significant and preventable public health problem. Lead negatively
- 7 affects every system of the body. It is harmful to individuals of all
- 8 ages and is especially harmful to children, fetuses, and adults of
- 9 child-bearing age. The effects of lead on a child's cognitive,
- 10 behavioral, and developmental abilities may necessitate large
- 11 expenditures of public funds for health care and special education.
- 12 The irreversible damage to children and subsequent expenditures could
- 13 be avoided if exposure to lead is reduced.
- 14 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The department of health is directed to
- 15 implement a public health education program aimed at reducing childhood
- 16 exposure to lead in residential settings. The program will continue
- 17 the current efforts of the department to identify areas around the
- 18 state where lead exposure poses a threat to children and families, and

- 1 will provide information, education, and training to areas of concern.
- 2 The program will especially focus on older housing stock, and the
- 3 residential hazards of lead-based paint. The department is directed to
- 4 seek federal funding for the lead hazards education project and to

5 operate it using these funds.
