SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5520

- 1 AN ACT Relating to information about ballot measures; amending
- 2 RCW 29.81.250; and adding a new section to chapter 29.79 RCW.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 29.79
- 5 RCW to read as follows:
- 6 The office of financial management, in consultation with the
- 7 secretary of state, the attorney general, and any other
- 8 appropriate state or local agency, shall prepare a fiscal impact
- 9 statement for each of the following state ballot measures: (1) An
- 10 initiative to the people that is certified to the ballot; (2) an
- 11 initiative to the legislature that will appear on the ballot; (3)
- 12 an alternative measure appearing on the ballot that the
- 13 legislature proposes to an initiative to the legislature; (4) a
- 14 referendum bill referred to voters by the legislature; and (5) a
- 15 referendum measure appearing on the ballot. Fiscal impact
- 16 statements must be written in clear and concise language and avoid
- 17 legal and technical terms when possible, and may include easily
- 18 understood graphics.

- 1 A fiscal impact statement must describe any projected increase
- 2 or decrease in revenues, costs, expenditures, or indebtedness that
- 3 the state or local governments will experience if the ballot
- 4 measure were approved by state voters. Where appropriate, a fiscal
- 5 impact statement may include both estimated dollar amounts and a
- 6 description placing the estimated dollar amounts into context. A
- 7 fiscal impact statement must include both a summary of not to
- 8 exceed one hundred words and a more detailed statement that
- 9 includes the assumptions that were made to develop the fiscal
- 10 impacts.
- 11 Fiscal impact statements must be available online from the
- 12 secretary of state's web site and included in the state voters'
- 13 pamphlet.
- 14 **Sec. 2.** RCW 29.81.250 and 1999 c 260 s 5 are each amended to read
- 15 as follows:
- 16 The secretary of state shall determine the format and layout of
- 17 the voters' pamphlet. The secretary of state shall print the
- 18 pamphlet in clear, readable type on a size, quality, and weight of
- 19 paper that in the judgment of the secretary of state best serves
- 20 the voters. The pamphlet must contain a table of contents. Federal
- 21 and state offices must appear in the pamphlet in the same sequence
- 22 as they appear on the ballot. Measures and arguments must be
- 23 printed in the order specified by RCW 29.79.300.
- 24 The voters' pamphlet must provide the following information for
- 25 each statewide issue on the ballot:
- 26 (1) The legal identification of the measure by serial
- 27 designation or number;
- 28 (2) The official ballot title of the measure;
- 29 (3) A statement prepared by the attorney general explaining the
- 30 law as it presently exists;
- 31 (4) A statement prepared by the attorney general explaining the
- 32 effect of the proposed measure if it becomes law;
- 33 (5) The fiscal impact statement prepared under section 1 of
- 34 this act;
- 35 (6) The total number of votes cast for and against the measure
- 36 in the senate and house of representatives, if the measure has
- 37 been passed by the legislature;

 $((\frac{6}{}))$ An argument advocating the voters' approval of the 1 2 measure together with any statement in rebuttal of the opposing 3 argument; 4 $((\frac{7}{1}))$ (8) An argument advocating the voters' rejection of the 5 measure together with any statement in rebuttal of the opposing 6 argument; 7 (((8))) Each argument or rebuttal statement must be followed by the names of the committee members who submitted them, 8 9 and may be followed by a telephone number that citizens may call to obtain information on the ballot measure; 10 $((\frac{9}{10}))$ (10) The full text of each measure. 11
