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## ENGROSSED SECOND SUBSTITUTE SENATE BILL 5936

- 1 AN ACT Relating to funds for operating and maintenance of low-
- 2 income housing projects and for innovative housing demonstration
- 3 projects; amending RCW 36.18.010; adding a new section to chapter
- 4 36.22 RCW; adding a new section to chapter 43.330 RCW; and
- 5 creating a new section.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 7 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature recognizes housing
- 8 affordability has become a significant problem for a large portion
- 9 of society in many parts of Washington state in recent years. The
- 10 state has traditionally focused its resources on housing for low-
- 11 income populations. Additional funding resources are needed for
- 12 operation and maintenance activities for housing projects for the
- 13 developmentally disabled and farm worker housing projects. In
- 14 addition to supporting low-income populations, the state must find
- 15 new methods to assist moderate and middle-income populations who
- 16 are having a difficult time affording decent housing at today's
- 17 prices reasonably near their jobs.

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- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 36.22 2 RCW to read as follows:
- 3 (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, a 4 surcharge of three dollars per instrument shall be charged by the
- 5 county auditor for each document recorded, which will be in
- 6 addition to any other charge authorized by law. The auditor may
- 7 retain up to ten percent of these funds collected to administer
- 8 the collection of these funds. Of the remaining funds, forty
- 9 percent of the revenue generated through this surcharge will be
- 10 transmitted monthly to the state treasurer who will deposit the
- 11 funds into the Washington housing trust account. The office of
- 12 community development of the department of community, trade, and
- 13 economic development will develop guidelines for the use of these
- 14 funds to support operation and maintenance costs of low-income
- 15 housing projects that have been developed with housing trust
- 16 funds. Sixty percent of the revenue generated by this surcharge
- 17 will be retained by the county and be deposited into a fund that
- 18 must be used by the county and its cities and towns for low-income
- 19 housing projects. For purposes of distributing the portion of the
- 20 surcharge retained by a county pursuant to subsection (2) of this
- 21 section, the funds shall be allocated among the county and the
- 22 cities within a county through an interlocal agreement between the
- 23 county and the cities within the county to jointly carry out the
- 24 purposes of this act.
- 25 (2) The surcharge imposed in this section does not apply to
- 26 assignments or substitutions of previously recorded deeds of
- 27 trust.
- 28 Sec. 3. RCW 36.18.010 and 1999 c 233 s 3 are each amended to read
- 29 as follows:
- 30 County auditors or recording officers shall collect the
- 31 following fees for their official services:
- 32 For recording instruments, for the first page eight and one-
- 33 half by fourteen inches or less, five dollars; for each additional
- 34 page eight and one-half by fourteen inches or less, one dollar.
- 35 The fee for recording multiple transactions contained in one
- 36 instrument will be calculated for each transaction requiring
- 37 separate indexing as required under RCW 65.04.050 as follows: The

- 1 fee for each title or transaction is the same fee as the first
- 2 page of any additional recorded document; the fee for additional
- 3 pages is the same fee as for any additional pages for any recorded
- 4 document; the fee for the additional pages may be collected only
- 5 once and may not be collected for each title or transaction;
- 6 For preparing and certifying copies, for the first page eight
- 7 and one-half by fourteen inches or less, three dollars; for each
- 8 additional page eight and one-half by fourteen inches or less, one
- 9 dollar;
- 10 For preparing noncertified copies, for each page eight and one-
- 11 half by fourteen inches or less, one dollar;
- 12 For administering an oath or taking an affidavit, with or
- 13 without seal, two dollars;
- 14 For issuing a marriage license, eight dollars, (this fee
- 15 includes taking necessary affidavits, filing returns, indexing,
- 16 and transmittal of a record of the marriage to the state registrar
- 17 of vital statistics) plus an additional five-dollar fee for use
- 18 and support of the prevention of child abuse and neglect
- 19 activities to be transmitted monthly to the state treasurer and
- 20 deposited in the state general fund plus an additional ten-dollar
- 21 fee to be transmitted monthly to the state treasurer and deposited
- 22 in the state general fund. The legislature intends to appropriate
- 23 an amount at least equal to the revenue generated by this fee for
- 24 the purposes of the displaced homemaker act, chapter 28B.04 RCW;
- 25 For searching records per hour, eight dollars;
- 26 For recording plats, fifty cents for each lot except cemetery
- 27 plats for which the charge shall be twenty-five cents per lot;
- 28 also one dollar for each acknowledgment, dedication, and
- 29 description: PROVIDED, That there shall be a minimum fee of twenty-
- 30 five dollars per plat;
- 31 For recording of miscellaneous records not listed above, for
- 32 the first page eight and one-half by fourteen inches or less, five
- 33 dollars; for each additional page eight and one-half by fourteen
- 34 inches or less, one dollar;
- 35 For modernization and improvement of the recording and indexing
- 36 system, a surcharge as provided in RCW 36.22.170.
- For recording an emergency nonstandard document as provided in

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- 1 RCW 65.04.047, fifty dollars, in addition to all other applicable
- 2 recording fees.
- 3 For recording instruments, a surcharge as provided in section 2
- 4 of this act.
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. A new section is added to chapter 43.330
- 6 RCW to read as follows:
- 7 The office of community development of the department of
- 8 community, trade, and economic development is directed to conduct
- 9 a statewide housing market analysis by region. The purpose of the
- 10 analysis is to identify areas of greatest need for the appropriate
- 11 investment of state affordable housing funds. The analysis shall be
- 12 completed by September 2002, and updated every two years
- 13 thereafter. Funding for this analysis is from revenue identified in
- 14 section 2 of this act.

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
